- 03/11 Governor Dunleavy declares a Public Health Disaster Emergency.
- 03/14 Governor Dunleavy announces the first confirmed case of COVID-19 in Alaska.
- 03/20 Governor Dunleavy announces Alaska COVID-19 Economic Stabilization Plan.
- 03/25 First out-of-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Washington.
- 03/27 First in-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Anchorage.
- 03/28 Case count in the state exceeds 100.
- 04/07 Case count in the state exceeds 200.
- 04/09 President Trump approves a major disaster declaration for Alaska.
- 04/16 Case count in the state exceeds 300.
- 05/20 Case count in the state exceeds 400.
- 06/03 Case count in the state exceeds 500.
- 07/02 Case count in the state exceeds 1,000.
- 07/13 Case count in the state exceeds 1,450.

Weather Forecast (Statewide)

Anchorage & Mat-Su

- Slippery roads – melt/refreeze, but some areas won't melt until Wednesday

Gulf Coast Region

- Whiteout conditions at Thompson Pass Monday
- Avalanche concern on Richardson Highway from Valdez to Thompson Pass

Southwest

- Minor beach erosion and coastal flooding possible Tuesday
- IFR flight conditions Tues afternoon thru Wed
- Kuskokwim Delta & Bristol Bay - Possible strong winds along the coast Wed – gusts to 45 mph

Interior

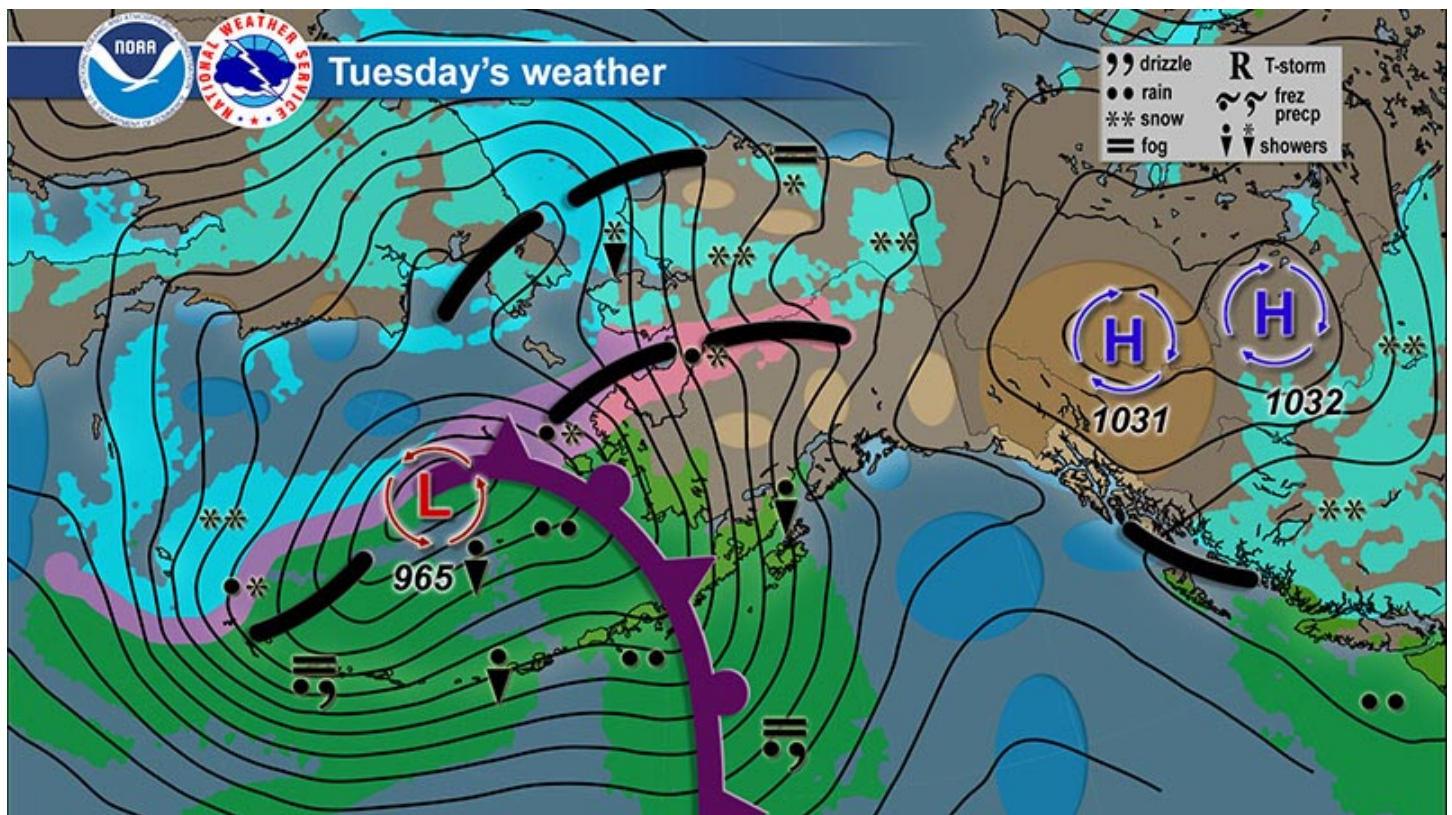
- Eastern Interior & E Alaska Range – heavy snow with low visibility Monday
- Western Interior – snow & blowing snow Monday afternoon thru Tuesday morning

Northern

- Dalton Hwy – Down to 1 lane around Atigun Pass due to avalanches. Minimal additional snowfall
- Minor beach erosion and coastal flooding possible Monday evening thru Tuesday
- Snow & blowing snow Mon afternoon thru Tues

Southeast

- Rain on snow Monday – snow loading
- Snow returns Wednesday
