- 03/25 First out-of-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Washington.
- 03/27 First in-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Anchorage.
- 03/28 Case count in the state exceeds 100.
- 04/07 Case count in the state exceeds 200.
- 04/09 President Trump approves a major disaster declaration for Alaska.

Northern

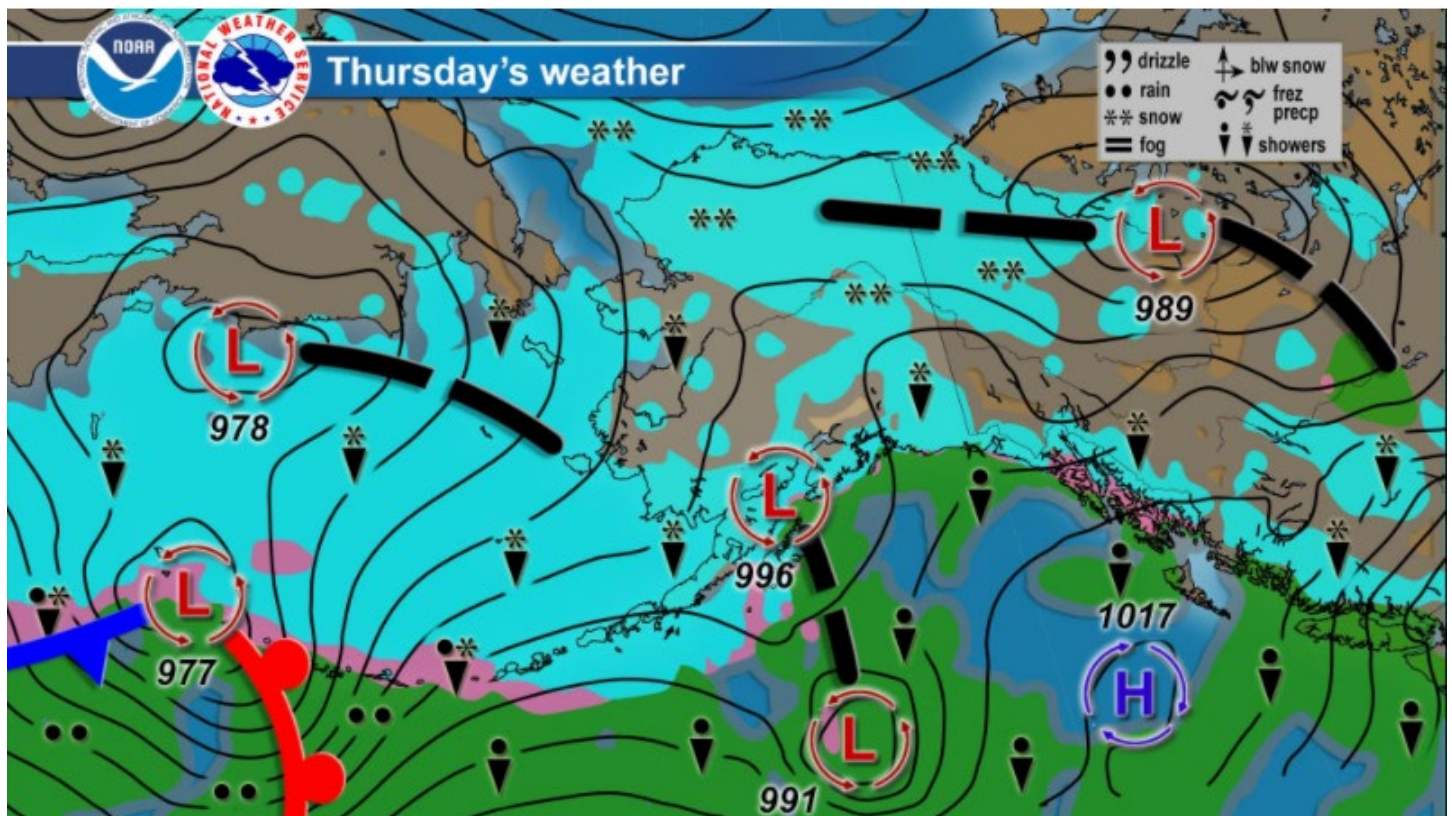
- Blowing snow reduced visibility along the coast today
