Haines Mass Care

The Red Cross reported sheltering 12 people overnight in non-congregate facilities in Haines. Additional individuals who have been displaced are staying with friends and family within the community.

Haines Home Damage

The Red Cross conducted initial damage assessments on 10 December and findings were 9 destroyed, 4 with major damage and 20 inaccessible. The Red Cross is currently working to provide full details of their assessments to the state to inform future joint-damage assessments by DHS&EM and FEMA.

Northern

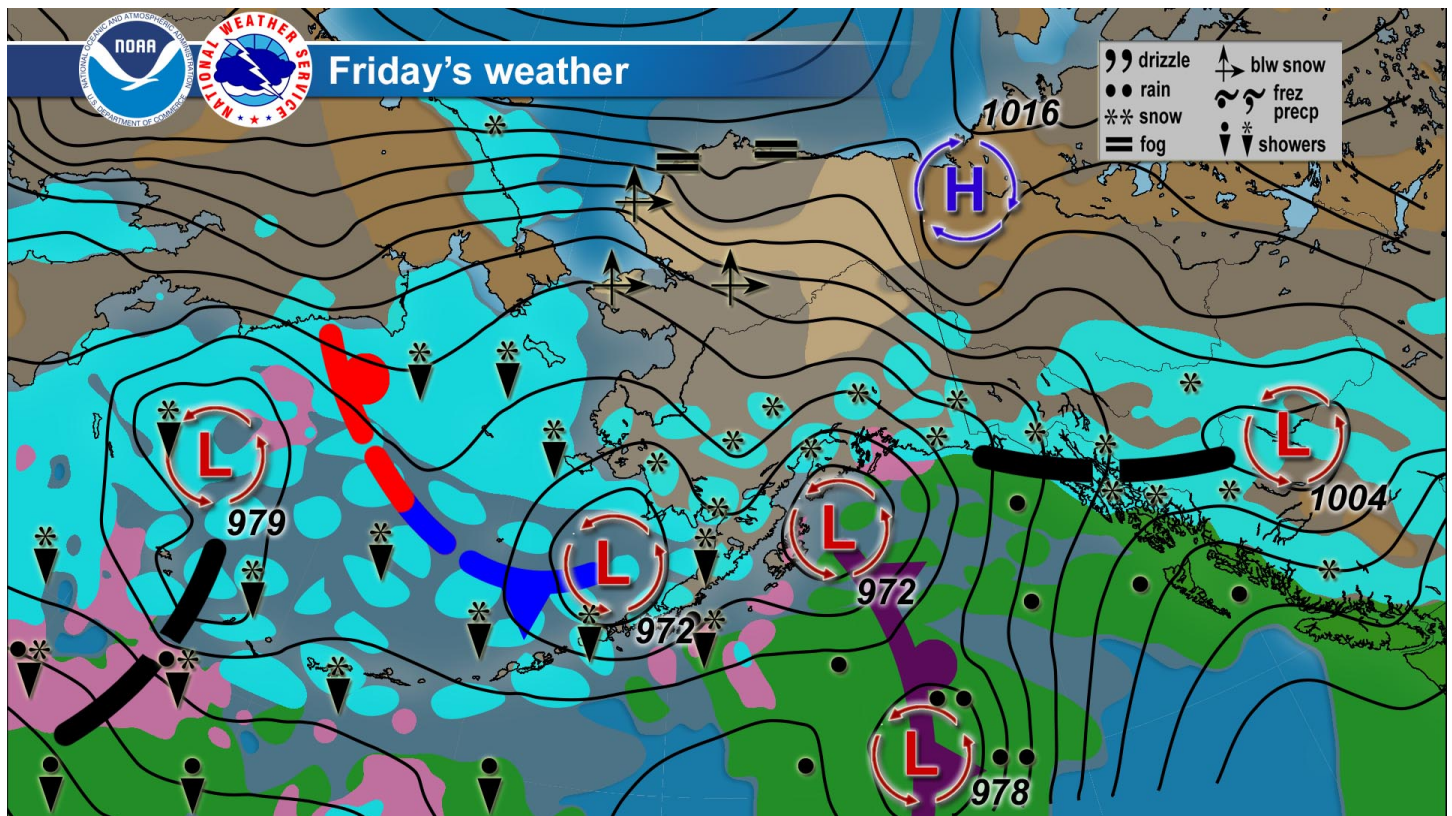
- Blowing snow and fog along Arctic coast
