Hosted by FEMA and the Alaska Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHS & EM), this course is designed as an introduction to the fundamental concepts of the benefit-cost (BC) analysis. Participants will learn how to obtain BC data and conduct analyses using the latest version of the Benefit Cost Toolkit.

The primary audience for this course is Federal, state, local, and tribal hazard mitigation staff; applicants/grantees; subapplicants/subgrantees; and personnel who are involved in the grant application development process and provide technical assistance.
