### **Incident Overview**

### State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) Activated to Level 3

- The Cook Inlet Earthquake occurred at 08:29 AKST on 11/30/2018. The quake measured M7.0 with an epicenter 7 miles NW of JBER, at a depth of 27.0 miles.
- ❖ Aftershocks continue. Since 11/30/2018, 35 greater than M4.0 have been recorded.
- Former Governor Walker declared a disaster on 11/30/2018.
- President Trump issued an emergency declaration on 11/30/2018.
- Matanuska Susitna Borough and Municipality of Anchorage have both declared local disaster emergencies.
- ❖ The SEOC has activated the State's Individual Assistance Program for earthquake survivors. Individuals and families affected by the earthquake can register online at <a href="ready.alaska.gov">ready.alaska.gov</a> or by calling 1-855-445-7131.
- Multiagency Individual and Public Assistance Joint Preliminary Damage Assessments (JPDA) are concluding this week. Agencies include; State of Alaska, FEMA, local jurisdictions, and Small Business Administration.


