Significant Issues:

West Coast Alaska Storm:

A very strong low is forecast to move through the Aleutians and move up the Western Alaskan Coast, late Thursday night (Sept 15) through Sunday (Sept 18), impacting communities in the Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta, Norton Sound, and Seward Peninsula. This is the remnant of Tropical Strom Merbok. High winds are forecast along with storm surge and heavy rain.

SEOC has moved to Preparedness Level 2 – *Heighten Awareness* – in response to this forecast and is actively engaged with the National Weather Service and communities in the storm's path to support their storm readiness and local response to storm impacts.



Significant Weather:



The Following weather watches, warnings, or advisories have been issued:

- St Lwarence Island, Bering Straight Coast, Yukon Delta, Southern Seward Peninsula Coast, Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills – Coastal flood warning in effect from 6:00PM Friday to 10:00AM Sunday. Significant coastal flooding expected.
- Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula, Chukchi Sea, Baldwin Peninsula and Selawik Valley – Coastal flood watch and high wind warning now in effect from Saturday evening through Sunday afternoon.
- Kuskokwim Delta Coastal flood watch and high wind warning remains in effect from Friday afternoon through Saturday. Water levels are expected to rise 4-7 feet above normal highest tide line with gusts up to 80 mph expected.
- Central and Western Aleutians High winds watch remains in effect from 10:00PM evening through 10:00AM Friday morning. Southwest winds 50 to 70 mph with gusts up to 90 mph expected.
- Pribilof Islands High wind warning remains in effect from 10:00AM Friday to 1:00AM Saturday. Southwest winds 50 to 65 mph with gusts up to 90 mph expected.
