Significant Issues

Alaska Wildland 2024 Fire Season Statewide Overall:

 No Red Flag today in the Interior but windy ahead of the front which is forecast to bring wetting rains this weekend to much of the state.

Globe Fire #253 – Elliot Highway

- Last night SEOC worked with the Fire Incident Command during high winds and Red Flag conditions to issue a Wireless Emergency Alert for an expanded GO! Evacuation area adding an additional 10 miles north. (Elliot Hwy milepost 30-65).
- SEOC meeting daily (virtually) with IMT on the Fire (Grapefruit Complex).

Riley Fire #318- Denali

- GO! Evacuation area unchanged (Denali National Park Joint Venture Facility).
- 90 people sheltered overnight at the Tri-Valley High School in Healy.
- Denali National Park closed. Fire is 5% contained.
- Power Restored and fully functional.
- SEOC in daily contact with Fire IMT and Borough.

Montana Creek Fire #312 – Mat-Su

- No substantial changes, progress in containment 40%.
- Overnight fatality in structure fire area of fire origin.

McDonald Fire #119- Fairbanks

No substantial changes, progress in containment.

SEOC worked with ADEC, Bristol Bay Health Corporation (BBHC), and Mass Care groups today to support the community's water needs and repairs. BBHC sent in 2 pallets of drinking water and the tribe supplied 4 pallets to supplement public drinking water. The 60 residents are receiving 4 gallons per minute from their public water system but there is damage to the well and the summer commercial fishery population water demand is straining the damaged system.

Alaska Wildland 2024 Fire Season Evacuation Status:

Globe Fire #253 (Grapefruit Complex):

- Go- Red: None
- Set- Yellow Elliott Hwy Milepost 30-57
- Ready-Green: Milepost 18-65 DOT has closed the Elliott Hwy at Mile Post 57 due to flooding.

Riley Creek Fire #318 (Denali):

- Go- Red: All Bison Gulch and Antler Ridge hikers, Riley Creek Campground and all employees housed at the Denali National Park Joint Venture facility. ANYONE IN RED AREAS SHOULD EVACUATE.
- Set- Yellow: There are currently no locations in "set".
- Ready-Green: The Nenana Canyon area (aka Glitter Gulch), Denali National Park Headquarters, C-Camp. Stay alert and monitor for evacuation status updates.

Montana Creek Fire #312 (Mat-Su Valley):

- Go- None
- The "set" status that was issued for area residents along the Leroy Davie Road and Montana Creek Road corridors has been lifted.
- Ready- None

The Montana Creek Fire crews, located 16 miles south of Talkeetna, continue to patrol the perimeter, moving further into the black. Continued cooler weather and rain aid fire crews. Crews look to mitigate hazards, being ever mindful that the moisture can cause slippery conditions and the forecasted southerly winds can cause blow overs. Fire is 67% contained at this time.

McDonald Fire #119 (Fairbanks North Star Borough):

- Go- Red: None
- Set- Yellow Cabins in the Tanana South area.
- Ready-Green: Areas along the Salcha River, Harding Lake, Hollies Acres, Canaday, Salcha, and Johnson Road neighborhoods.


The Alaska Interagency Coordination Center is now at Preparedness Level 4
