

## **Special Weather Statement:**

- Northern Seward Peninsula; Shishmaref; Bering Strait Coast; Southern Seward Peninsula Coast; Interior Seward Peninsula; Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills; Yukon Delta Coast; Lower Yukon River; St Lawrence Island – A coastal storm is expected to impact the West Coast of Alaska Thursday and Friday.
- Dalton Highway Summits; White Mountains and High Terrain South of the Yukon River; Upper Chena River Valley; Tanana Flats; Eielson AFB and Salcha; Goldstream Valley and Nenana Hills; Chatanika River Valley; Two Rivers; Fairbanks Metro Area; Nenana; Central Interior – Gusty winds Thursday and Friday
- Lower Kuskokwim Valley; Kuskokwim Delta; Bristol Bay Active storm track to bring several rounds of heavy rain, winds, and possible coastal impacts to Southwest Alaska
