# Significant Issues:

## Southeast Rain/Wind:

Rain and wind events are in the forecast for this week for Southeast, due to increased amounts of rain the SEOC contacted the City of Ketchikan last Friday to ensure the most current information was being shared from the National Weather Service. In addition to the contact with Ketchikan, SEOC along with many other local and state agency partners continue to closely monitor the Suicide Basin in Juneau.


