Significant Issues:

2024 October West Coast Storm:

A joint Preliminary Damage Assessment team combined with State, FEMA, and SBA completed the damage assessments in Kotzebue. The State will return later today.

Brevig Mission Power Outage:

SEOC was contacted regarding a community-wide power outage. AVEC deployed a worker who was able to restore power last night. SEOC will continue to offer help as needed.

Russian Mission Water Outage:

Water supply was restored to the community as of last night.

Ketchikan Landslide:

The community has experienced small landslides with no impacts but have concerns about a potential landslide occurring that could trigger damages to structures and cause flooding. State Geologist deployed to the community yesterday to assess the slope and assist in mitigation efforts. SEOC is in communication with the community of Ketchikan and DGGS and will offer support as needed.

Kiana Frozen Water Line:

Northwest Arctic Borough (NWAB) reported that Kiana was experiencing a frozen water supply line leaving the community without running water. Maniilaq deployed a Remote Maintenance Worker. Work continues thawing lines to restore water pumping. The community of Kiana and the NWAB declared a local disaster yesterday afternoon.

Kwigillinok Power Outage:

Alaska Energy Authority reported that the community's power is now stable. The school and teacher

housing continues to use a standby generator to partially power the water and sewer lines, until repairs can be completed on their generator. New generators for the community are being procured but won't be available until early next year.


