Significant Issues:

2024 October West Coast Storm:

Preliminary Damage Assessment team returned to Anchorage last night. A full Out-Brief is scheduled for Monday.

Brevig Mission Power Outage:

Power has been restored and the community is stable.

Ketchikan Landslide:

The community has experienced small landslides with no impacts but have concerns about a potential landslide occurring that could trigger damages to structures and cause flooding. **SEOC is working closely with the Ketchikan EOC and will offer support as needed.**

Kiana Frozen Water Line:

Governor Dunleavy declared a disaster for Kiana and the Northwest Arctic Borough (NWAB) yesterday. A full multi-agency response is ongoing.

Tsunami Warning California and Oregon Coasts:

A magnitude 7.0 earthquake off California's northern coast triggered a tsunami warning yesterday. Alaska's SEOC was involved in the operational calls for a potential expansion of the warning and mutual aid. The Warning was cancelled after earthquake analysis and water measurements showed no damaging tsunami was generated. California is evaluating for earthquake damage.

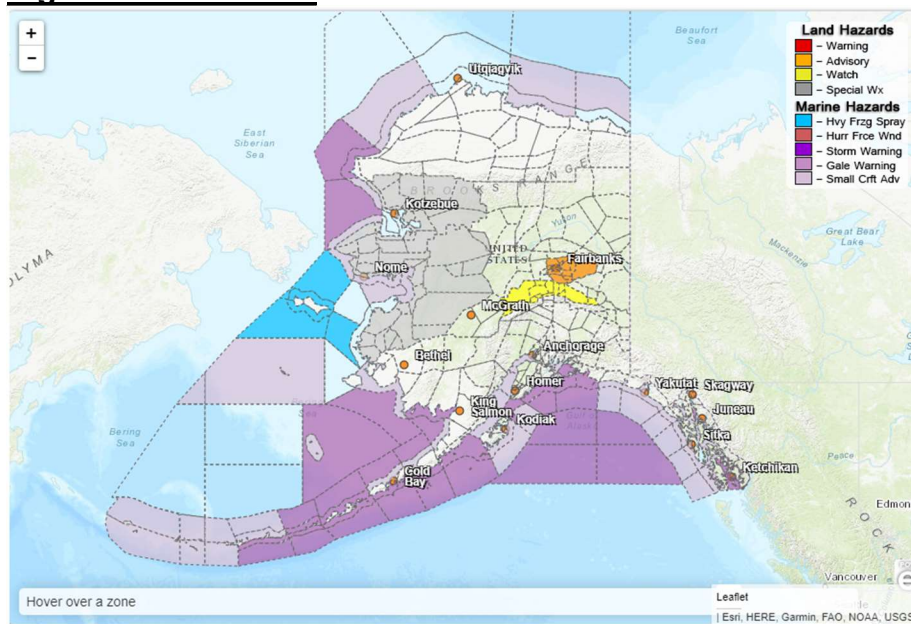

Dense Fog Advisory:

- **Upper Chena River Valley; Tanana Flats; Eielson AFB and Salcha; Goldstream Valley and Nenana Hills; Chatanika River Valley; Two Rivers; Fairbanks Metro Area** – in effect until Noon today for Fairbanks North Star Borough.

High Wind Watch:

- **Northern Denali Borough; Eastern Alaska Range North of Trims Camp** -in effect from Sunday morning through Monday afternoon.

Special Weather Statement:
