### **Significant Issues:**

#### **City of Hooper Bay:**

SEOC was notified of a power outage affecting the community's water pump and water availability. A Boil Water Notice was placed in effect until enough water can be pumped to clear the lines and fill the tank. A RMW from ANTHC restored power to the water system and continues to work on preparing the tank for use. The community expects to have potable water by end of day Friday.

#### **Adak Power Issue:**

SEOC received word yesterday from Adak's City Manager that power was out to the entire community of Adak. TDX power company was engaged with repairs and was able to get 90% power restored to community by end of day. TDX is aware of ongoing power disturbances due to outdated distribution system. SEOC will follow up today to verify complete power restoration.

#### **Kiana Frozen Water Line:**

Governor Dunleavy declared a disaster for Kiana and the Northwest Arctic Borough (NWAB). Thawing efforts to frozen pipes is on-going. SEOC will attend the EOC community briefing today and will continue to offer support as needed.

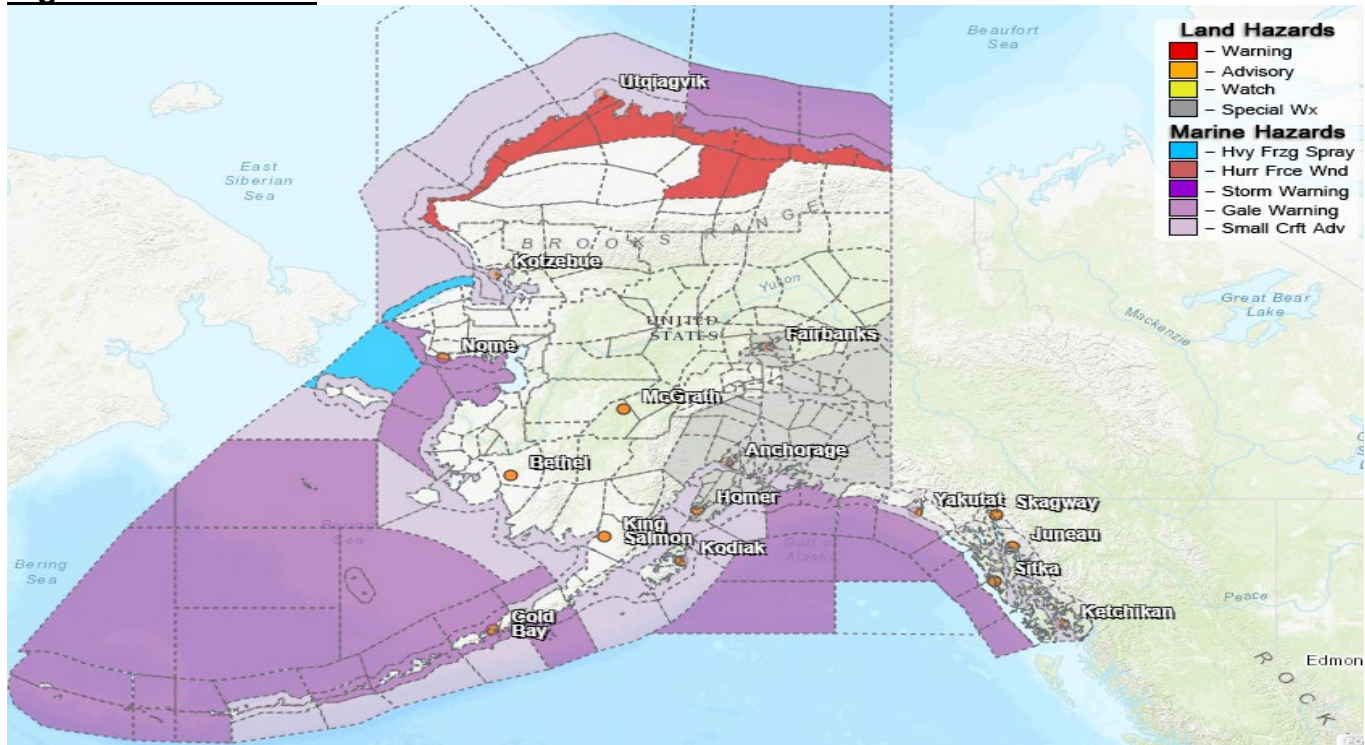

### **Special Weather Statement:**

- **Fortymile Country, Upper Tanana Valley, Delta Junction, Eastern Alaska Range North of Trims Camp, Eastern Alaska Range South of Trims Camp**-significant snow likely Thursday and Friday.
- **Tanana Flats, Eielson AFB and Salcha, Goldstream Valley and Nenana Hills, Chatanika River Valley, Two Rivers, Fairbanks Metro Area, Nenana**-accumulating snow likely Thursday and Friday.

### **Blizzard Warning:**

- **Western Arctic Coast, Northwest Arctic Coast, Northern Arctic Coast**- remains in effect from midnight tonight to 3pm on Friday.
- **Central Arctic Plains, Eastern Beaufort Sea Coast, Central Beaufort Sea Coast**- remains in effect from 3pm this afternoon to 3pm on Friday.

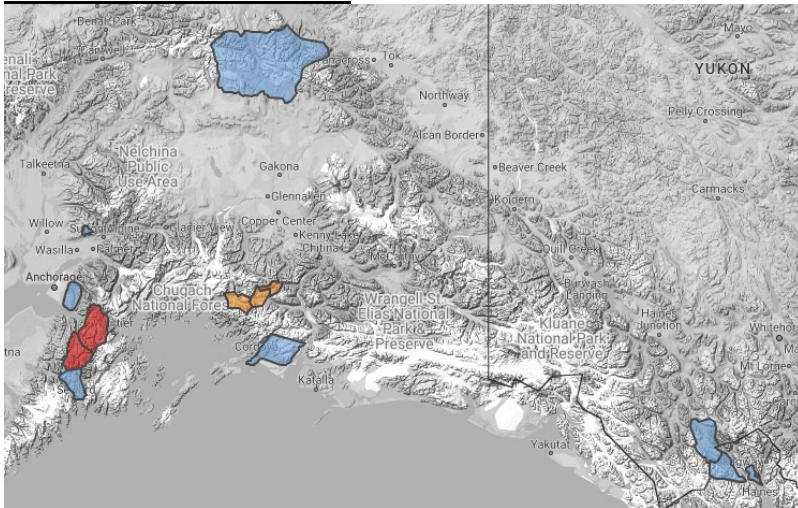
### **Hydrologic Outlook:**

- **Anchorage, East Turnagain Arm, Matanuska Valley, Western Kenai Peninsula, Western Prince William Sound, Northeast Prince William Sound, Southeast Prince William Sound, Copper River Basin, Susitna Valley**-ice action on area rivers could produce some jam flooding due to recent warm temperatures.

- **Turnagain Pass** – Avalanche danger is High. Strong east winds are blowing at the ridgetops and another 2 to 3" of rain is forecast with heavy snow above 2,500'.
- **Valdez** – Considerable above 1500'.
