Riverwatch:

SITREP - May 13, 2024

Governor Dunleavy has declared a disaster for the Kuskokwim River communities in the Lower Kuskokwim and Yupiit Regional Education Attendance Areas in response to flooding. The disaster recovery Individual Assistance program, that provides grant funding to individuals and families with damaged to primary residence or essential personal property lost during the flooding, is now open for those in the declared area. Riverwatch:

Middle Yukon Division:

Division conducted aerial surveillance this weekend on the Yukon River from Galena to Koyukuk, Rampart, and Nulato. Division briefed community leaders by radio or in-person.

No serious ice jam threats were observed. Division intends to fly the river again today monitoring conditions.

Flood watch for Circle was canceled.

Fort Yukon Communities Snowmelt Flood Concern:

With the persistent cold temperatures this year, heavy snow remains in the mountains of Cananda, causing concern for snowmelt flooding on the Old Crow and Porcupine Rivers in Cananda. Cananda has mobilized flood teams. This same snowmelt flood concern will become an issue for the Yukon

communities in and around Fort Yukon in 8 to 14 days. SEOC and National Weather Service are in direct contact with Canadian officials and are carefully monitoring.

Kuskokwim Division:

All ice jams on the Kuskokwim have released. Water levels continue to drop. Ice jam flood threat is low for all communities downriver. Division is transitioning from response to recovery operations and implementation of disaster recovery programs pursuant to Governor Dunleavy's declaration of disaster.

Division will provide impacted residents with state disaster Individual Assistance information and collect damage information for the state disaster Public Assistance program.

Over the weekend Division checked conditions for the Kuskokwim Delta communities and the outlying tundra villages in and around Nunapitchuk.

Bethel – Minor flooding ongoing. Division checked all areas of concern over the weekend and met with City officials. Division will provide impacted residents with state disaster Individual Assistance information and collect damage information for state disaster Public Assistance program.

Kwethluk – Community flooding continues. Division flew to Kwethluk multiple times this weekend, moving AVCP VPSOs and delivering equipment and bottled water. While water has dropped 1-1.5 ft over the last 24 hours, most of the village is still inundated. **Flood Warning remains in effect.**

Napaskiak – Division flew to the community multiple times this weekend. Division supported demobilization of AVCP response VPSO as conditions improved.

Napakiak – Flooding reported. Division supported demobilization of AVCP response VPSO as conditions improved.




