Significant Issues:

Riverwatch:

Lower Yukon Division:

Saturday ice jammed on the lower Yukon River between St. Mary's and Pilot Station causing flooding in Pilot Station. SEOC engaged with the Pilot Station Search and Rescue, Alaska State Troopers, and National Weather Service Saturday and Sunday as the water rose. By Sunday afternoon the jam released, and water dropped in Pilot Station by 3'. With the jam release, water levels are expected to rise at St. Mary's, Pitka's Point, and Mountain Village.

SEOC will hold a Lower Yukon Community call today and continues to evaluate the risk to Lower Yukon communities including Emmonak and Alakanuk.

A Flood Waring is in effect for Pilot Station.

A Flood Watch is in effect for St. Mary's, Pitka's Point, and Mountain Village.

Fort Yukon Communities Snowmelt Flood Concern:

There is concern for snowmelt flooding for Alaska's Yukon communities in and around Fort Yukon later this week from snowmelt through Canadian Porcupine Rivers. SEOC and National Weather Service are in direct contact with Canadian officials and are carefully monitoring.

2024 Spring Flood Disaster Kuskokwim Division:

Governor Dunleavy has declared a disaster for the Kuskokwim River communities in the Lower Kuskokwim and Yupiit Regional Education Attendance Areas in response to flooding. The disaster recovery Individual Assistance program, that provides grant funding to individuals and families with damaged to primary residence or essential personal property lost during the flooding, is now open for those in the declared area.

Wainwright Power Outage:

Power was restored to the community Friday morning.

The DOH stands ready to assist with all aspects of public health and, in the event of a public health emergency, is supported by the SEOC and other state departments as required.


