Significant Issues:

2025 Riverwatch Operations:

Kusko Division - Based in bethel

Last night, the Division flew the Kuskokwim to Kalskag and landed to assess conditions. Later that night the ice jam below Kalskag broke and water receded by two feet. Ice jam flood risk for this community has passed.

The Division is in direct contact with Alaska National Guard UH-60 Blackhawk crew stationed in Bethel for contingency operations.

The team will continue today to check Kuskokwim River conditions near Kalskag and down river. Flood Warning – Canceled late Tuesday night.

Upper Yukon Division – Based in Fairbanks

Yesterday the Division flew to Fort Yukon, did ground reconnaissance, met with community leaders, and briefed on KZPA Radio. Minor flooding was noted to cemetery and tribal parking lot, but no critical infrastructure or residences impacted. Departed and surveyed the Yukon River to Beaver, then returned to Fairbanks. Water reported receding at Fort Yukon later in the day.

The Division will continue to monitor conditions on the Upper Yukon River today. Plans to demobilize team based on ice front moving down river towards Middle Yukon Division break. *Flood Watch - Canceled*

Middle Yukon Division: Based in Galena

Deployed today from Anchorage, anticipate flight ops to begin tomorrow.

Special Weather Statement:

Northern Denali Borough; Southern Denali Borough; Eastern Alaska Range North of Trims Camp; Eastern Alaska Range South of Trims Camp -

Snow returns to the Alaska Range, with snow-levels falling to road level. Snow rates may be heavy at times with 3 to 7 inches of snow expected by this evening. Visibility could be reduced to around a half mile during the heaviest snowfall. Snow is expected to change over to a rain/snow mix by this afternoon. This will bring slick road conditions overnight tonight as everything begins to freeze over. Travelers should use extra caution as they traverse the Alaska Range along the Parks and Richardson Highway.


Hydrologic Outlook:

The Yukon River at Ft. Yukon broke up Tuesday with minor flooding from an ice jam that released overnight. The breakup front is expected at Stevens Village and the Dalton Highway bridge sometime Wednesday or Thursday.
