Significant Issues:

State Disaster Declaration - Denali Borough – Wildland Fire Losses

State of Alaska Governor Mike Dunleavy has declared a state disaster emergency for the Denali Borough, implementing the state's Public Assistance and Individual Assistance recovery programs, in response to the fire losses of residential structures in the Borough.

The state's Individual Assistance program is designed to help individuals and families recover from damage to their primary resident and other essential property. <https://ready.alaska.gov/recovery/IA>

SEOC staff continue to assist Denali Borough at the local EOC contacting residents, identifying and coordinating sheltering needs and collecting damage assessments.

There are many active wildfires across the state. The Alaska Interagency Coordination Center is at Preparedness Level 4, with 190 active fires statewide over 270,000 acres burned, and over 800 firefighters engaged.

Old Glenn Hwy Flooding – Butte:

Water continues to recede, with DOT&PF continuing to place rip rap along the banks of the Matanuska River with expectations to complete work by the weekend. Cooler temps continue to favor water levels.

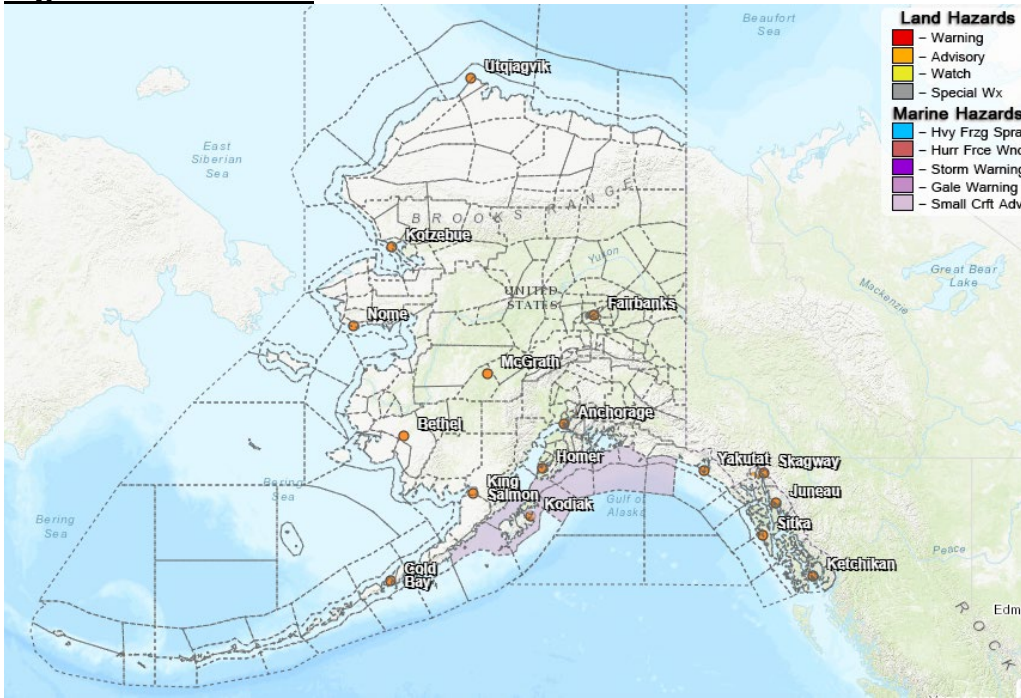

Flood Advisory: Haines Borough and Klukwan

- Flood Advisory for Snowmelt remains in effect extended to 4 PM AKDT Thursday afternoon, in particular the Chilkat River near areas around MP 14 & 24 of the Haines Highway, near Klukwan and the Chilkat River Bridge

Flood Advisory: Lower Matanuska Valley

- Flood Advisory: in effect extended until noon AKDT Friday. Flooding caused by snowmelt and channel shift of the Matanuska River near Butte, AK.
