Significant Issues:

Statewide Wildland Fires – State at Fire Preparedness Level 4

SEOC Division Supervisors (DIVSUP) for both the Denali and Fairbanks North Star Boroughs attended a public meeting in Ester Friday at the request of the Fire IC and following GO NOW evacuations issued in the area. SEOC DIVSUPs coordinated evacuation planning, and shelter support for evacuees with the Red Cross and Fairbanks North Star Borough Emergency Manager.

With reductions in evacuations due to decreased fire risk, several shelters have gone to standby status, with the ability to reopen if required.

Red Cross and Salvation Army have provided disaster support to survivors of the Bear Creek and St. George Fires in the Denali Borough who lost their homes, including emergency financial assistance, food boxes, clean up kits, and spiritual care. These same agencies also provided shelter support and food boxes to evacuees from the Nenana Ridge Complex Fires in the City of Nenana.

SEOC is implementing the state disaster declaration in the Denali Borough and has distributed an emergency grant, under the state disaster Individual Assistance program, for one resident who lost their home and has multiple applications in process.

SEOC is also working with Denali and Fairbanks North Star Boroughs on a Small Business Administration application for business that were disrupted by the fires and Parks Highway closures.

Juneau – Suicide Basin Glacier Outburst Flood Risk

SEOC held a meeting with the Federal Emergency Management Agency Friday to brief on the Glacial Outburst flood risk in Juneau. SEOC has initiated regular calls with the City and Borough of Juneau/Tlingit-Haida Tribe Unified Command to confirm preparedness and operational response planning.

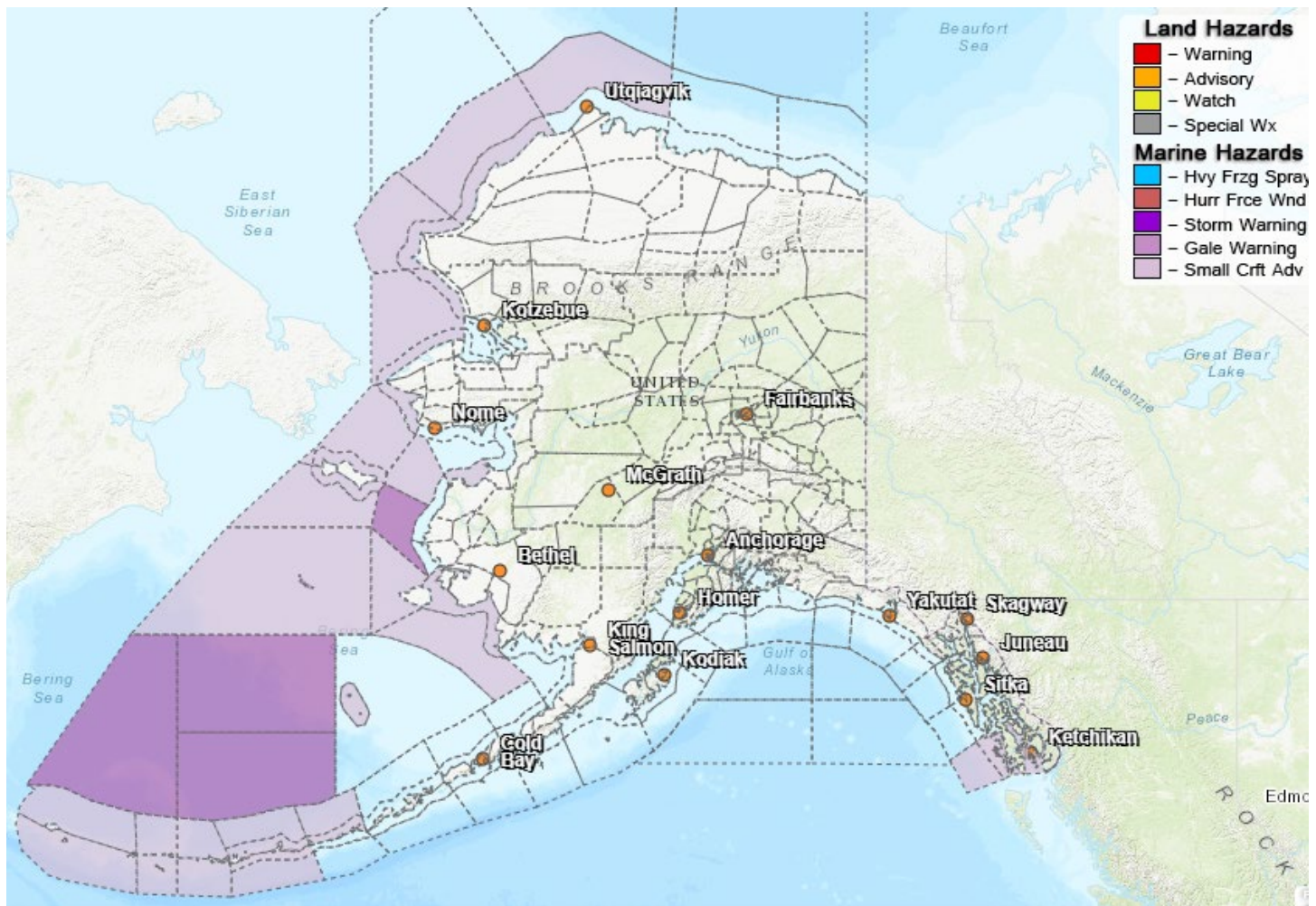
