Significant Issues:

Tsunami Warning - Sand Point Area Mag 7.3 Earthquake

The National Tsunami Warning Center (NTWC) issued a Tsunami Warning for Alaska's Southwest Coastal areas at 1244 AKDT yesterday for a magnitude 7.3 earthquake 50 miles from Sand Point.

- SEOC executed the Tsunami Warning Checklist, making positive contact with emergency managers in the coastal hazard areas and coordinating information across the state and with multiple agencies nationally and in British Columbia.
- SEOC had a responder in Kodiak for training, who responded to the Kodiak Police Department and provided situational awareness on the community evacuation.
- Multiple communities evacuated to high ground and some mariners took emergency actions.
- United States Coast Guard Kodiak sortied aircraft and ships, while making warning broadcasts on Marine CH 16.
- NTWC cell phone alerts went out in the warning area and in the Municipality of Anchorage and Kenai Peninsula Borough.
- The Warning was downgraded to an Advisory and then canceled at 1439 AKDT yesterday with a tsunami generated that was measured at 7 cm at Sand Point.
- SEOC worked with the community of Unalaska early this morning to troubleshoot technical issues with a persistent tsunami warning alert on cell phones, after the warning was canceled.
- SEOC communicated a situation update to FEMA early this morning and SEOC's Public Information Officer handled multiple media inquiries yesterday and today. There was nationwide attention on this event.
- There have been multiple aftershocks following the earthquake yesterday, the largest in the Mag 5.7 range. No additional tsunami warnings were issued.
- SEOC contacted the community of Sand Point and other communities within a 100-mile radius
 of the earthquake and has received no reports of damage as of this report.

Statewide Fire Situation:

- Weather continues to improve for statewide fire risk, with possible fire season ending southeasterly flow setting up next week, which is typical for late July in Alaska.
- 246 active fires in the state with 14 staff and 882,967 acres burned, 910 personnel engaged
