Juneau Glacial Lake Outburst Flood (GLOF) – State Disaster Declaration

Mendenhall river crested at 0715 at 16.65 feet and is now receding. *But flood waters remain at dangerous levels.* The incident remains active, and residents are advised to heed warnings and directions from local authorities. More information will be forthcoming from the City and Borough of Juneau and the Tlingit-Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska regarding recovery and support during damage assessments.

Presidential Summit in Alaska

The SEOC continues to monitor the scheduled Presidential Summit between President Trump and the President of Russia, Vladimir Putin. The White House has announced the location for the meeting to be on Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson in Anchorage on Friday. The SEOC will be activated with full incident management structure in place to respond to any local impacts or consequences.

Ash from Klyuchevskoy Volcano in Russia

Diffuse airborne ash is suspended in the air column from the eruption of a volcano on the Kamchatka Peninsula in Russia. However, based on current advisories, there is no threat of ashfall to surface levels over mainland Alaska.

Coastal Storm – West Coast of Alaska

The Seward Peninsula southward along the Yukon Delta Coast continues to be impacted by a coastal storm. Nome, White Mountain, and Golovan are currently under flood watch from heavy rainfall through Thursday evening. To date, no flooding has been reported. But the highest water levels on main stem rivers near the coast will likely be approximately 1 day after rainfall stops. Rainfall is expected to stop late Wednesday afternoon.

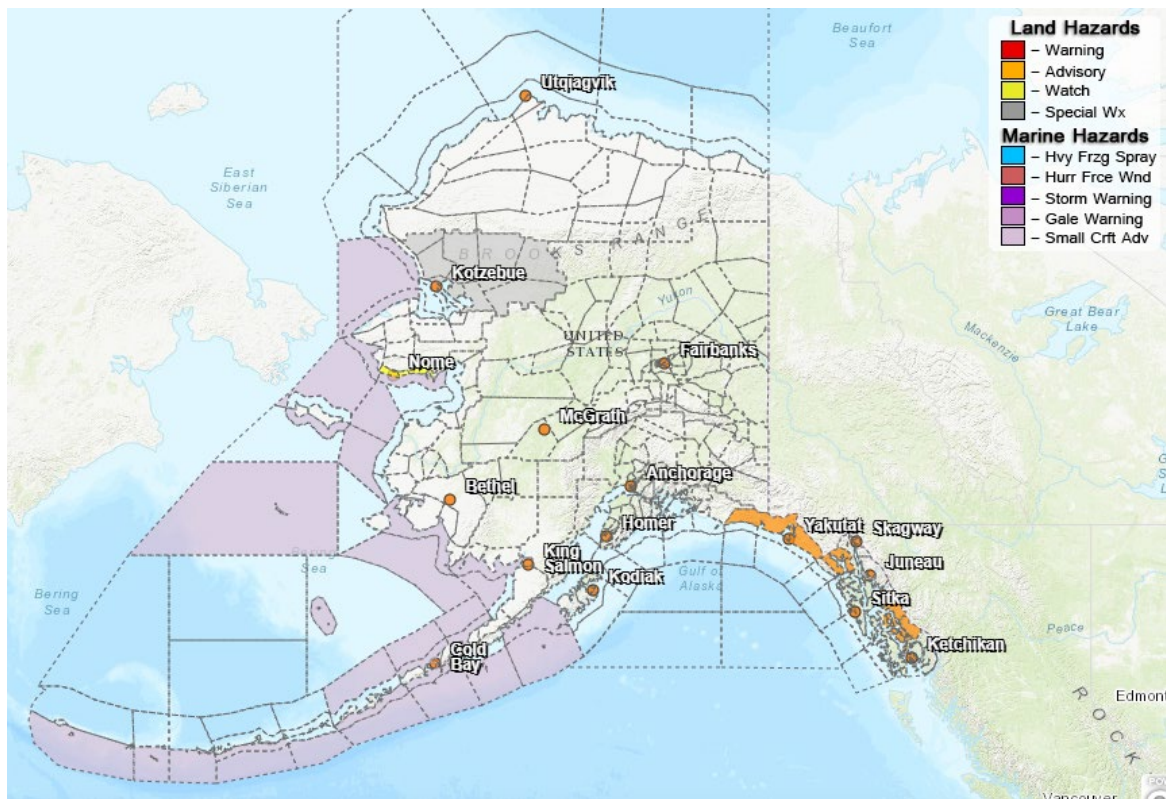

Significant Weather:



Flood Warning – City and Borough of Juneau: In effect until 0800 AKDT Thursday. Mendenhall river crested at 0715 at 16.65 feet and is now receding. Mendenhall Lake and River levels will continue to fall over the next 12- 36 hrs.

Flood Watch – Southern Seward Peninsula Coast including Nome, White Mountain, and Golovin: in effect through Thursday evening. Flooding in main stem rivers near the coast caused by excessive rainfall will be likely approx. 1 day after rainfall stops.

Hydrologic Outlook – South Slopes of the Western Brooks Range; Noatak Valley; Kivalina and Red Dog Dock; Lower Kobuk Valley; Upper Kobuk Valley: Prolonged Heavy Rain continues through Wednesday in the Western Brooks Range, total rainfall of 2-4 inches from a prolonged heavy rain event.
