Significant Issues:

Juneau Glacier Lake Outburst Flood

- SEOC continues to implement the state declaration of disaster, with state disaster individual assistance applications being provided to residents impacted by the flooding.
- Unified Command of the City and Borough of Juneau and Tlingit- Haida Tribes have completed local damage assessments of flooded residential properties. Red Cross is providing emergency assistance based upon this assessment.
- Saturday, Juneau Branch met with US Senator Sullivan and local leaders to brief on the flood impacts and success of the flood mitigation work.
- Flood response is transitioning to recovery, with demobilization of US Army Corps of Engineers responders and United Way volunteer and donation coordination.
