

# Significant Weather:



Heat Advisory – **City of Hyder**, until 7PM AKDT Monday. Temperatures up to around 80 degrees expected

Flood Watch – Southern Seward Peninsula Coast; Interior Seward Peninsula; Eastern Norton Sound, Nulato Hills, South Slopes Of The Central Brooks Range; South Slopes of the Western Brooks Range; Upper Kobuk Valleys. Flooding caused by excessive rainfall possible until Aug 4 PM AKDT this afternoon through Tuesday afternoon

Wind Advisory - Lower Koyukuk Valley; Middle Yukon Valley; Lower Yukon and Innoko Valleys; Upper Kuskokwim Valley. In effect from noon to 10 PM AKDT Tues.

Wind Advisory - Northern Denali Borough; Delta Junction; Eastern Alaska Range North of Trims Camp. In effect from 1 PM this afternoon to 4 AM AKDT Weds.

Hydrologic Outlook - Kuskokwim Valley West; Kuskokwim Valley East; Interior Kuskokwim Delta; Western Capes; Northern Bristol Bay Coast; Inland Bristol Bay. An atmospheric river will bring prolonged, widespread rainfall across SW Alaska this week.

Coastal Flooding Advisory - **Kuskokwim Delta Coast and Nunivak Island.** In effect from 11 AM to 6 PM AKDT Monday.

Flood Watch - Kuskokwim Valley West; Kuskokwim Valley East; Interior Kuskokwim Delta; Northern Bristol Bay Coast; Inland Bristol Bay. In effect from Monday morning through Thursday morning.

Hydrologic Outlook - White Mountains and High Terrain South of the Yukon River; Upper Chena River Valley; Chatanika River Valley; Two Rivers; Howard Pass and the Delong Mountains; Central Brooks Range; South Slopes Of The Central Brooks Range; South Slopes of the Western Brooks Range; Noatak Valley; Lower Kobuk Valley; Northern Seward Peninsula; Upper Kobuk Valleys; Southern Seward Peninsula Coast; Interior Seward Peninsula; Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills; Lower Yukon River; Lower Koyukuk Valley; Middle Yukon Valley; Lower Yukon and Innoko Valleys; Upper Koyukuk Valley; Dalton Highway Summits; Central Interior Moderate to heavy rainfall is expected to continue through early portions of the week. Highest rainfall totals could exceed 5 inches in isolated areas, typically at higher elevations in the Nulato Hills and the Brooks Range.
