Significant Issues:

SEOC Preparedness Level increased to level 2 for widespread weather impacting communities across the state.

Significant rainfall has impacted the southern Brooks range from a large weather system. The SEOC is engaged with communities in the impacted areas to assist with any needs that arise from flooding. The villages of Kobuk and Allakaket have reported the greatest impacts. Northwest Arctic Borough and Tanana Chiefs Conference are actively engaged with residents in those communities respectively to ensure safety of life and property.



Significant Weather:



Wind Advisory – **Dalton Highway Summits**: Southwest winds 15-20 mph with gust up to 40 mph, in effect from noon today to 7 PM this evening

Flood Warning – **Upper Koyokuk Valley, Koyokuk River at Allakaket:** Flooding caused by excessive rainfall continues, until noon AKDT Saturday

Flood Advisory – **Upper Kobuk Valleys, Kobuk River at Kobuk:** Flooding caused by excessive rainfall continues, until noon AKDT Saturday

Flood Watch – South Slopes of the Western Brooks Range; Noatak Valley; Upper Kobuk Valleys; Lower Koyukuk Valley; Upper Koyukuk Valley: Flooding caused by excessive rainfall continues to be possible, in effect through Friday Morning

Hydrologic Outlook - South Slopes of the Central Brooks Range; South Slopes of the Western Brooks Range; Noatak Valley; Lower Kobuk Valley; Upper Kobuk Valleys; Lower Koyukuk Valley; Upper Koyukuk Valley: Headwater tributaries of Koyukuk, Kobuk and Noatak Rivers have received substantial rainfall in the last several days leading to record crests with rainfall continuing in the Western and Central Brooks Range through Friday.

Wind Advisory - Yukon Flats; White Mountains and High Terrain South of the Yukon River; Upper Chena River Valley; Tanana Flats; Eielson AFB and Salcha; Goldstream Valley and Nenana Hills; Chatanika River Valley; Two Rivers; Fairbanks Metro Area; Nenana; Central Interior: Southwest winds 15-25 mph with gusts up to 40 mph expected, in effect from noon today to 7 PM this evening.

Wind Advisory – Delta Junction; Eastern Alaska Range North of Trims Camp; Eastern Alaska Range South of Trims Camp: Southeast to South winds gusting up to 55-65 mph, until 10 AM Friday

Flood Warning - Western Susitna Valley; Southern Susitna Valley; Central Susitna Valley; for the Yentna River and tributaries at and above Lake Creek: Crest is expected around Friday night into early Saturday morning, warning in effect until 10 AM Sunday

Flood Watch - Western Susitna Valley; Southern Susitna Valley; Central Susitna Valley; Northern Susitna Valley: Including Skwentna, Willow, Talkeetna, Trapper Creek, Petersville, Chulitna, Broad Pass and Denali Highway, Flooding caused by excessive rainfall (2-4 inches) through Friday afternoon

Flood Warning – **Northern Denali Borough**; **Sanctuary River near Denali Park Road**: Flooding caused by excessive rainfall is expected, in effect until 10 PM Friday

Special Weather Statement - Northern Copper Valley; Western Copper Valley; Central Copper Valley; Ernestine; Southern Copper Valley: Strong winds to continue across the area, expected through Friday Evening

Hydrologic Outlook - Kuskokwim Valley West; Kuskokwim Valley East; Interior Kuskokwim Delta; Western Capes; Northern Bristol Bay Coast; Inland Bristol Bay: Flooding caused by excessive rainfall continues to be possible, in effect through Thursday morning.

Hydrologic Outlook - Anchorage; Anchorage Hillside / Eagle River; East Turnagain Arm; Portage; Lower Matanuska Valley; Hatcher Pass; Sutton / Upper Matanuska Valley; Eureka / Tahneta Pass; Southern Kachemak Bay; SW Kenai Peninsula; NW Kenai Peninsula; Skilak Lake; Southern Kenai Mtns; Interior Kenai Peninsula; Turnagain Pass; West Prince William Sound & Whittier; Tyonek; Valdez; Thompson Pass; Cordova; Western Susitna Valley; Southern Susitna Valley; Central Susitna Valley; Northern Susitna Valley: Significant rainfall Wednesday through Friday will bring river rises and localized flood potential across southcentral Alaska

Flood Watch – **Southern Kenai Mtns, including Seward:** Flooding caused by excessive rainfall is possible 3 to 5 inches of rainfall, in effect through Friday Morning.

Flood Advisory - Southern Kenai Mtns; Interior Kenai Peninsula, specifically Seward and Bear Creek Neighborhoods: Flooding caused by excessive rainfall, in effect until noon Friday Heat Advisory - Prince of Wales Island; Ketchikan Gateway Borough; City of Hyder; Annette Island: Temperatures up to 80 expected, in effect until 7 PM this evening
