Significant Issues:

Typhoon Halong: West Coast Storm: *see attachments

Current priorities focus on life-sustainment operations and winter readiness throughout Yukon–Kuskokwim Delta communities. Key efforts include coordinated missions in Kwigillingok and the opening of a new Disaster Assistance Center (DAC) in Bethel. Preparations are also underway to shift operational responsibilities from the SEOC to the Joint Field Office (JFO) later this week.

Emerging Incidents:

The SEOC is actively monitoring developing weather conditions for portions of the Western Aleutians.

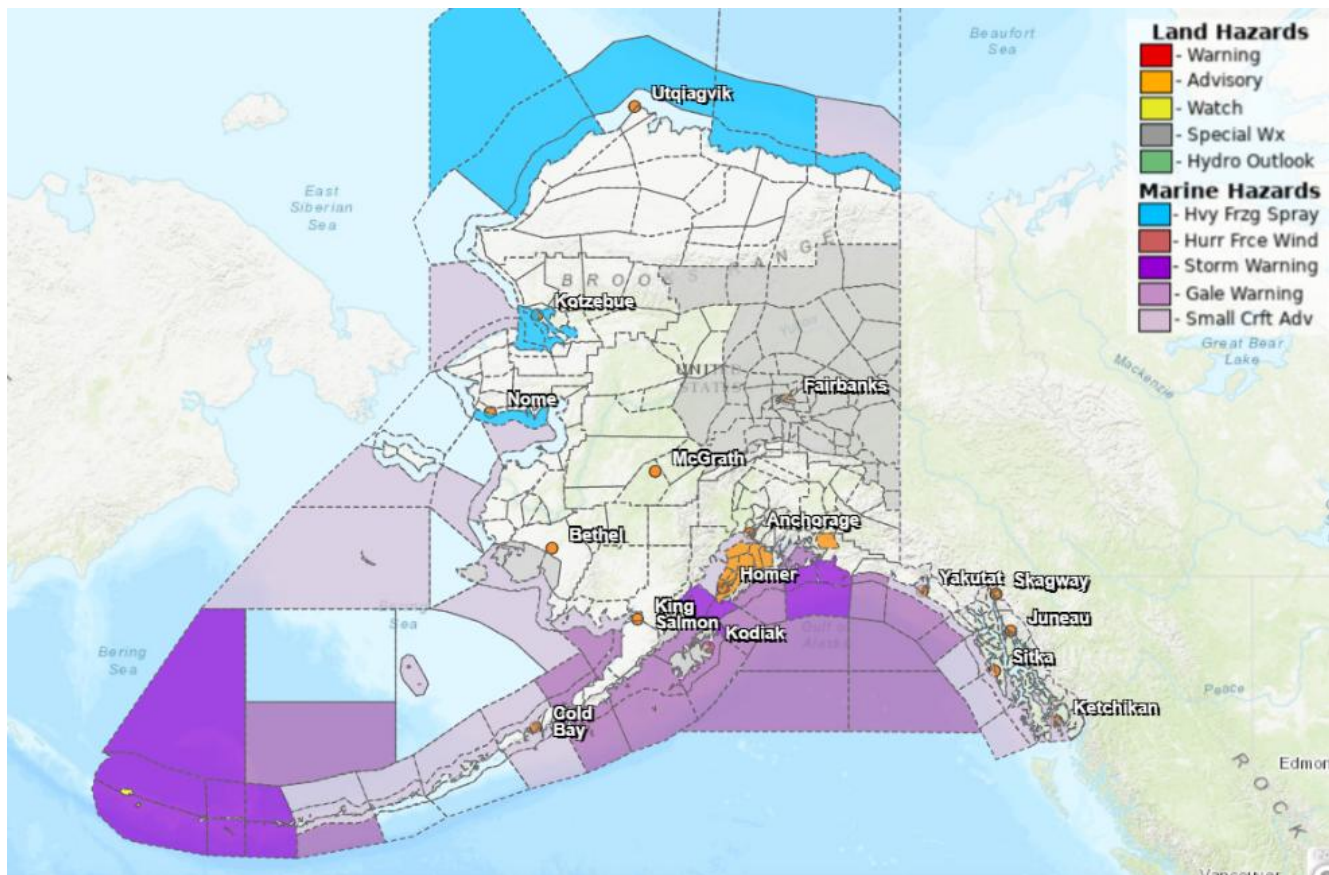

Significant Weather:



High Wind Watch: Western Aleutians – In effect from Friday morning through Saturday morning.

Special Weather Statement: Fortymile Country, Upper Tanana Valley, Delta Junction, Upper Chena River Valley, Tanana Flats, Eielson AFB and Salcha, Goldstream Valley and Nenana Hills, Chatanika River Valley, Two Rivers, Fairbanks Metro Area, Nenana, Central Interior, Northern Denali Borough, and Eastern Alaska Range North of Trims Camp – Light snowfall expected across the Interior through Saturday.

South Slopes of the Eastern and Central Brooks Range, Dalton Highway Summits, Yukon Flats, White Mountains, and High Terrain South of the Yukon River – Light snowfall expected across the Interior through Saturday.

Kuskokwim Delta Coast and Nunivak Island – Increased water levels expected along the Kuskokwim Coast this weekend.

Kodiak Island Northeast and Southwest – Resuspended ash from Katmai–Novarupta expected through Friday night.

Southern Kenai Mountains – Strong winds and periods of snow and rain/snow mix through Friday morning.

Portage Valley – Periods of heavy snow before changing to rain by early Friday morning.

Winter Weather Advisory: Southern Kachemak Bay and Southwest Kenai Peninsula – In effect from 6 PM this evening to 9 AM AKST Friday.

Northwest Kenai Peninsula and Skilak Lake – In effect from 3 PM this afternoon to 6 AM AKST Friday.

Interior Kenai Peninsula and Turnagain Pass – In effect from 10 AM this morning to 6 AM AKST Friday.
