


Avalanche Hazards:

Summit Lake – Considerable at upper elevations, above 2,500ft

- Haines Borough and Klukwan from 3am Saturday to 3pm Sunday
- Municipality of Skagway from 10pm tonight to 3pm Sunday

Winter Storm Watch in effect for:

- City and Borough of Yakutat from late tonight through late Saturday night
- Kuskokwim Delta Coast and Nunivak Island from Saturday afternoon through Monday afternoon
- Northern Copper Valley, Northern Susitna Valley, and Tok Cutoff from this evening through Sunday evening

Winter Weather Advisory in effect for:

- Central Alaska Peninsula and Southern Alaska Peninsula from noon Saturday to 9am Sunday
- Eureka/Tahneta Pass, Western Copper Valley, Central Copper Valley, Ernestine, Southern Copper Valley and McCarthy until 5pm Saturday
