Significant Issues:

2026 January Southeast Winter Storm Disaster

Juneau – Juneau Update:

SEOC has demobilized back to JBER due to improving conditions; however, the SEOC Recovery Branch PA Group Supervisor remains in place to support disaster cost recovery. Additional short-duration heavy rain and high winds are expected. The evacuation area is now limited to the Behrends slide path, but increased slide risk has prompted CBJ to reissue an evacuation alert for that area only. SEOC has resource ordered DGGS to assist DOT&PF with avalanche analysis.

Hoonah

Salvation Army is supporting the community with snow removal, thawing services, and heater repairs for disabled residents. They have also purchased and donated 60 shovels to assist with snow clearing. The Hoonah Senior Center is using the Salvation Army kitchen to prepare meals. Salvation Army is also providing hotel accommodation for one displaced family due to power loss.




