

WINTER STORM WARNING — Glacier Bay; Cape Fairweather to Lisianski Strait; Prince of Wales Island; City and Borough of Sitka; City and Borough of Yakutat; White Mountains and High Terrain South of the Yukon River; Upper Chena River Valley; Tanana Flats; Eielson AFB and Salcha; Goldstream Valley and Nenana Hills; Chatanika River Valley; Two Rivers; Fairbanks Metro Area; Nenana; Central Interior; Northern Denali Borough; Upper Koyukuk Valley. remains in effect until 6 AM–7 AM AKST Friday (varies by area); Prince of Wales/Sitka also in effect through 9 AM AKST Friday.

WATCHES:

HIGH WIND WATCH — Kodiak Island Northeast remains in effect from this evening through late tonight. Thompson Pass remains in effect from late tonight through late Friday night.

WINTER STORM WATCH — Western Arctic Coast; Noatak Valley; Kivalina and Red Dog Dock; Lower Kobuk Valley; Baldwin Peninsula; Northern Seward Peninsula; Shishmaref; Bering Strait Coast; Southern Seward Peninsula Coast; Interior Seward Peninsula in effect from late Friday night through Sunday afternoon.


ADVISORIES:

WIND ADVISORY — Valdez remains in effect from 1 AM Friday to 6 AM AKST Saturday. Southern Kenai Mountains; West Prince William Sound and Whittier remains in effect from 1 PM this afternoon to 6 PM AKST Friday. Glacier Bay; Eastern Chichagof Island; Admiralty Island now in effect until 3 AM AKST Friday. Upper Tanana Valley in effect from 3 PM this afternoon to noon AKST Friday.

WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY — City and Borough of Juneau now in effect until 3 AM AKST Friday. Petersburg Borough; Western Kupreanof and Kuiu Island; City and Borough of Wrangell — remains in effect from noon today to 6 AM AKST Friday. Ketchikan Gateway Borough; Annette Island remains in effect from 6 PM this evening to 9 AM AKST Friday.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT: City and Borough of Juneau — winds likely this weekend.

Avalanche Conditions:

Hatcher Pass – Considerable above 3500'; Moderate below 3500'; Low below 2500'.

Turnagain Pass and Girdwood – Moderate above 2500'; Low below 2500' and treeline.

Summit Lake – Moderate above 2500'; Low below 2500' and treeline.

Seward and Lost Lake – Moderate above 2500'; Low below 2500' and treeline

Maritime – Considerable above 1500' Moderate below 1500'.

Intermountain – Considerable above 2000' Moderate below 2000'.

Continental – Considerable above 2000' Moderate below 2000'.
