

Avalanche Conditions:



Hatcher Pass – Moderate above 3500'; low below 3500'.

Turnagain Pass and Girdwood – Moderate above 2500'; Low below 2500' and treeline.

Summit Lake – Moderate above 2500'; Low below 2500' and treeline.

Seward and Lost Lake – Moderate above 2500'; Low below 2500 and treeline.

Maritime – Considerable at 1500' up, Moderate below 1500'.

Intermountain – Considerable at 2000' up, Moderate below 2000'

Continental – Considerable at 2000' up, Moderate below 2000'
