Significant Issues:

Koyuk – Power Issues

Northwest Arctic Borough contacted SEOC about power issues in Koyuk with temps at -30. Alaska Village Electric Cooperative is engaged.

Cold Bay – Power Issues

USCG contacted SEOC about a widespread power outage in Cold Bay. SEOC spoke with DOT&PF, and city officials, who reported a transformer failure. Alaska Energy Authority and the SEOC are engaged.

2025 October West Coast Storm Disaster:

- 116 households/374 individuals transitioned from non-congregate shelters (hotels) to longer-term housing (apartments)




Southern Kachemak Bay — special weather statement in effect
