

### **WARNINGS:**

Blizzard Warning until 4 PM AKDT Wednesday for the Eastern Beaufort Sea Coast.

Winter Storm Warning until 1 PM AKDT this afternoon for the City and Borough of Juneau.

### **ADVISORIES:**

Winter Weather Advisory until 10 AM AKDT this morning for Sitka, Petersburg Borough, Western Kupreanof and Kuiu Island, Prince of Wales Island, Wrangell, Ketchikan Gateway Borough, and Annette Island.

Winter Weather Advisory until 4 PM AKDT Tuesday for the Northern Seward Peninsula.

Winter Weather Advisory until 4 PM AKDT Wednesday for the Central Beaufort Sea Coast and Central Arctic Plains (Blizzard Warning cancelled for these areas).

Cold Weather Advisory until 10 AM AKDT this morning for Kodiak Island Southwest.

Cold Weather Advisory until 1 PM AKDT this afternoon for the Kuskokwim Delta Coast and Nunivak Island, Interior Kuskokwim Delta, and Western Capes.

Cold Weather Advisory until 2 PM AKDT Wednesday for the Central Alaska Peninsula, Chignik, and Southern Alaska Peninsula.

Wind Advisory until 6 PM AKDT Tuesday for the Southern Kenai Mountains.

### Avalanche Conditions:



**Hatcher Pass** – Low below 2500', Moderate above.

**Turnagain Pass and Girdwood** – Moderate at all levels.

**Summit Lake** – Moderate 1'000' and above, Low below 1000'

**Seward and Lost Lake** – Moderate 1'000' and above, Low below 1000'.

**Maritime** – Considerable 1500' and above, Moderate below 1500'.

**Intermountain** – Considerable 2000' and above, Moderate below 2000'.

**Continental** – Considerable 2000' and above, Moderate below 2000'.

**Chugach State Park** – Considerable at all levels

**Douglas Island**- Hazard has dropped to low at all elevations with a thick melt freeze crust in place effectively locking up the snowpack. With significantly less than forecasted new snow totals overnight, the main problem today is potentially difficult skiing atop the variable crust. Watch for unstable snow on isolated terrain features.
