

Winter Weather Advisory until 4 PM AKDT Wednesday for the Central Beaufort Sea Coast and Central Arctic Plains.



Hatcher Pass – Moderate above 3500', Low below 3500'.

Turnagain Pass and Girdwood – Moderate above 1000' low below 1000' and treeline.

Summit Lake – Moderate 2500' and above, Low below 2500'.

Seward and Lost Lake – Moderate 1'000' and above, Low below 1000'.

Maritime – Considerable at all levels.

Intermountain – Considerable at all levels.

Continental – Considerable at all levels.

Chugach State Park – Considerable at all levels.

Douglas Island – Low at all levels.

Chiklat Pass – Low at treeline and above.
