Significant Issues:

Port Alsworth Power Outage:

Last night, the SEOC was notified that the community had suffered a complete power loss. With assistance from AEA, city staff was able to isolate three phase faults and restore power to half of the community. A lineman and equipment are scheduled to arrive today to attempt a complete restoration of power.

State Declaration for the Northwest Arctic Borough:

Governor Dunleavy has declared a state disaster for the Northwest Arctic Borough, including the communities of Ambler, Selawik, Buckland and Shungnak, resulting from a period of prolonged extreme cold and subsequent water and wastewater utility freezeups.

2025 October West Coast Storm Disaster:

144 households/ 495 individuals transitioned from non-congregate shelters (hotels) to longer-term housing (apartments)



until 6pm this evening.


Winter Weather Advisory is in effect for Prince of Wales Island until 10pm this evening.

Avalanche Conditions:



Hatcher Pass – Moderate above 2,500' low below 2500'.

Chugach State Park – Moderate above 1,000' low below 1000'.

Turnagain Pass and Girdwood – Moderate below at all elevations.

Summit Lake – Moderate above 2500' low below 2500'.

Seward and Lost Lake – Low at all elevations.

Maritime, Intermountain, Continental – Moderate at all levels.

Haines area/Chiklat Pass – Considerable above treeline.

Douglas Island – Considerable at Upper Elevations, Moderate at mid and lower elevations
