Significant Issues:

Both Individual and Public Assistance were authorized by the Governor verbally declared disaster for the Yukon Flats and Yukon-Koyukuk REAAs for river ice flooding in the communities of Chalkyitsik and Hughes. See attachment*

Governor Mike Dunleavy has expanded his May 11, disaster declaration to include the Iditarod Regional Education Area (REAA) and the Lower Yukon REAA to the areas eligible for state disaster assistance programs. See attachment*

River Watch team (Lower Yukon Division) and the SEOC are available 24/7.

2026 Riverwatch Operations

Lower Yukon Division:

Yukon River breakup activity continues near Holy Cross, Russian Mission, and Marshall, with Holy Cross reporting water levels approximately 5 feet below the May 21 peak as of 7:30 AM May 22. River Watch reported the main jam downriver from Russian Mission released, while a smaller jam near Holy Cross was rapidly decaying and may still cause additional rising water and flooding at Russian Mission when it releases. At Marshall, ice jammed again on May 21, causing rapid water to rise to nearly bankfull at the lower end of town.

SEOC is engaged with TDX, and the City of Adak with the local disaster declaration and resolution efforts. Power systems are scheduled to be repaired and brought back online at the end of this weekend.

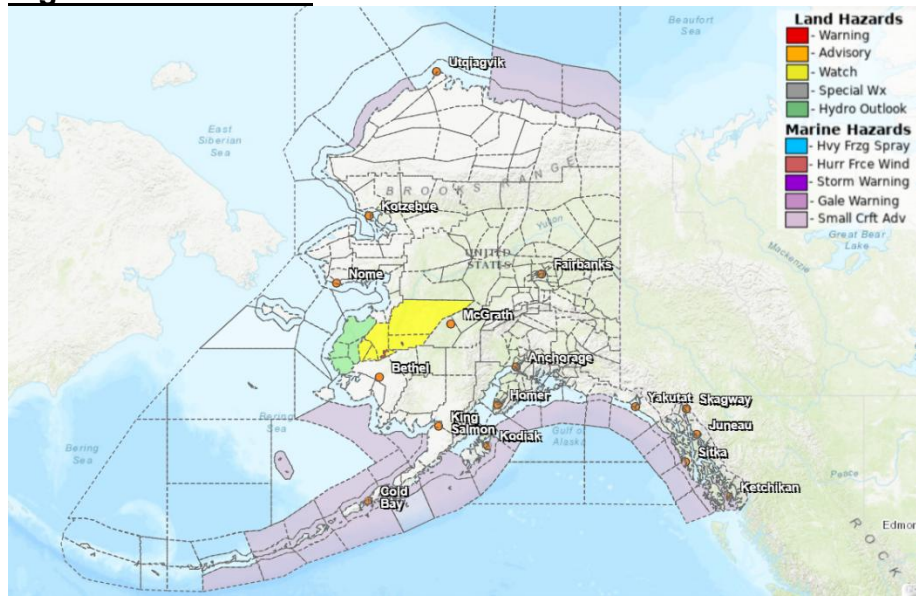

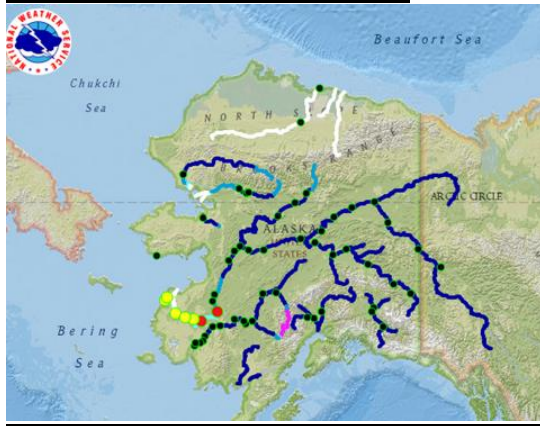
Ice Jam Flood Watch in effect for the Lower Yukon River and Lower Yukon and Innoko Valleys through Friday evening.
