Significant Issues:

In response to the imminent threat of catastrophic flooding caused by the release of Suicide Basin Lake, Governor Dunleavy has issued a State Disaster Declaration – see attached press release.

Flooding on the Mendenhall River is currently rising with crest now expected between **2PM-6PM this afternoon**. The National Weather Service has issued a flood warning with a new crest height of **15.8-16.3 ft**, in effect until Friday at 0430AM. City and Borough of Juneau has issued an evacuation advisory for the neighborhoods along the river that may be impacted.

Overnight 17 people sheltered at the Red Cross Shelter established at the Floyd Dryden Middle School. Back Loop bridge has been closed by DOT and Unified Command is working with Alaska Electric Light and Power to consider cutting power to potentially flooded areas to preserve infrastructure. Additionally, 4 dogs and 2 cats were being sheltered in the limited space at the American Red Cross Shelter.

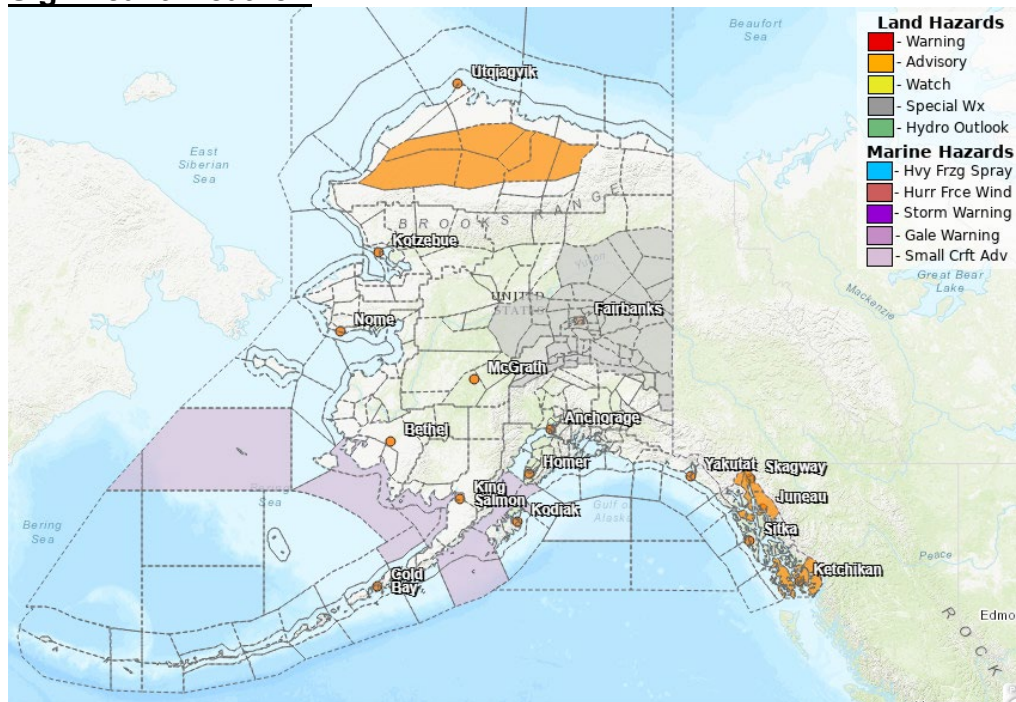

Flood Warning: City and Borough of Juneau, Mendenhall Lake and River, View Drive and below Back Loop Bridge. Glacier-Dammed Lake Outburst flooding in effect until 0430 AKDT Friday. **Crest flood waters expected at 2PM – 6 PM today**

Heat Advisory: City and Borough of Juneau and Eastern Chichagof Island. Temps in the lower 80s expected from noon today to 7PM Friday

Heat Advisory: Municipality of Skagway; Haines Borough and Klukwan. Temps in the low to mid 80s expected, from noon today **has been extended until 7PM Friday**

Heat Advisory: Prince of Wales Island; Ketchikan Gateway Borough; City of Hyder; Annette Island. Temps in the low to mid 80s expected, from noon today to 7PM Friday

Heat Advisory: Central and Western Arctic Plains. Hot temps as high as 80 degrees from 1PM this afternoon to 10PM this evening.
