The Mukluk Fire response is transitioning from suppression to recovery.

Cold, wet, and blustery weather moves in on Monday as the Alaska Complex Incident Management Team concludes its final day managing the Mukluk Fire. The incoming Type 3 organization — made up largely of Alaska firefighting and support personnel — will shadow the Alaska CIMT on Monday before taking command early Tuesday morning. Many incoming team members have already been working with outgoing counterparts. Both teams are coordinating to ensure a smooth transition as the focus shifts to suppression repair.

A small task force of firefighters spent the past several days conducting an assessment of structure loss. It has been determined that 50 single residences have been destroyed, as well as 108 outbuildings, garages, sheds, workshops, or other miscellaneous secondary structures.

The Alaska Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management is working with the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation Solid Waste Program to develop a plan to

support property owners as they clean-up fire damaged and destroyed items.

An EMAC VAL has arrived to assist with Donations Management and Mass Care. RurAL CAP is meeting with the community to support the Arctic Shelter mission and address ongoing needs.

Team Rubicon will assess remaining community and homeowner needs, including debris cleanup, hazardous tree removal, and firewood replacement.

SEOC Preparedness Level Change:

Due to the transition from active emergency response to recovery, SEOC has downgraded its Preparedness Level to 2 – Heightened Awareness. Operations continue in support of the Tok Wildland Fire recovery while SEOC transitions its focus to include the upcoming fall sea storm season.

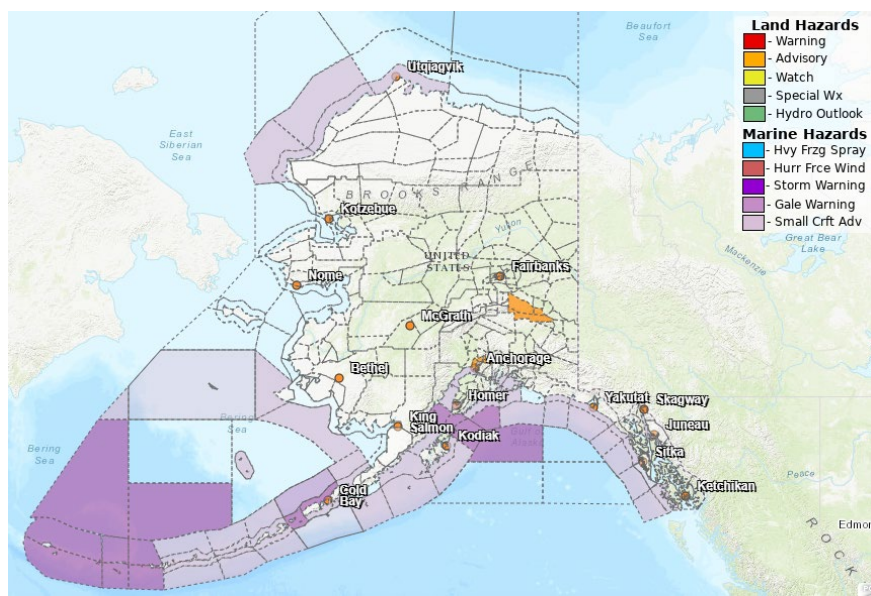

Winter Weather Advisory in effect:

Eastern Alaska Range North of Trims Camp; Eastern Alaska Range South of Trims Camp- Snow and breezy winds. Total snow accumulations of 3 to 7 inches above 2500 feet along the Richardson Highway near Isabel Pass, with heavier amounts above pass level. Northerly winds gusting as high as 40 mph until 4am Tuesday.

Frost Advisory:

Anchorage, Lower Matanuska Valley-Temperatures will be as low as 29 degrees on Tuesday will result in frost formation from 2am-9am Tuesday.
