Tok Mukluk Fire

Acres: 7,335

Containment: 29%

Location: Tok, AK

Start Date: Aug. 17, 2026

Fuels: Black Spruce, Shrubs, Grass

The Alaska Complex Incident Management Team concluded its final day managing the Mukluk Fire, with the incoming Type 3 organization shadowing the team before assuming command Tuesday morning. Damage assessments identified 50 destroyed residences and 108 destroyed outbuildings or secondary structures. An EMAC VAL arrived to support donations management and mass care, while RurAL CAP continued supporting the Arctic Shelter mission.

Team Rubicon assessed remaining community needs and requested 30 volunteers to support debris removal, hazardous tree mitigation, and firewood replacement. Six Alaska National Guard personnel prepared to demobilize from Tok and return to JBER.

DHSEM-Operations Specialist attended the 6:00 p.m. community meeting at Tok School and DHSEM-Disaster management continues to coordinating with DEC's Solid Waste Program on cleanup support for fire-damaged properties.

An EMAC VAL continues to assist with Donations Management and Mass Care. Rural CAP is meeting with the community to support the Arctic Shelter mission and address ongoing needs.

Team Rubicon will assess remaining community and homeowner needs, including debris cleanup, hazardous tree removal, and firewood replacement.

SEOC Preparedness Level Change:

Preparedness Level to Level 2 – Heightened Awareness. Operations continued in support of recovery efforts related to the Tok Wildland Fire, while the SEOC also transitioned its focus to include preparedness for the upcoming fall sea storm season.
