Tok Mukluk Fire

Acres: 7,335

Tok Mukluk Fire:

The Mukluk Fire has burned 7,335 acres and is 29% contained, with 29 personnel assigned. A local Type 4 organization, led by incoming Incident Commander Matt Durfey, assumed command of the Mukluk Fire early Tuesday morning. Many resources will remain in place to complete suppression-repair objectives and continue patrolling the fire.

The Tanana Chiefs Type 2 Initial Attack Crew returned Sunday to complete repair work in areas inaccessible to heavy equipment, patrol containment lines, and remove debris from those lines.

The EMAC Voluntary Agency Liaison (VAL) from Virginia demobilized from Tok today and will return to Virginia tomorrow. Team Rubicon has deployed to Tok and is actively supporting local recovery operations, including emergency shelter support, debris removal, and tree felling and cutting

Bering Sea Storm and Siberian-Chukchi Sea Low: *See Attachment

The National Weather Service (NWS) is tracking a storm system moving from the Western Bering Sea through Siberia and into the Chukchi Sea later this week. Widespread heavy precipitation, strong winds, and high surf conditions are expected across Western Alaska, with breezy winds and light-to-moderate rainfall anticipated across the Interior.

The SEOC has proactively contacted communities along the West Coast to ensure awareness of the incoming weather system. Local partners were encouraged to review preparedness measures, maintain situational awareness, and monitor NWS updates as conditions evolve.

Mount Kupreanof Activity Notice:

The number of earthquakes, intensity of steam emissions, and measured sulfur dioxide emissions beneath Mount Kupreanof have declined. Based on these changes, the Alaska Volcano Observatory has lowered the Aviation Color Code and Volcano Alert Level to UNASSIGNED.

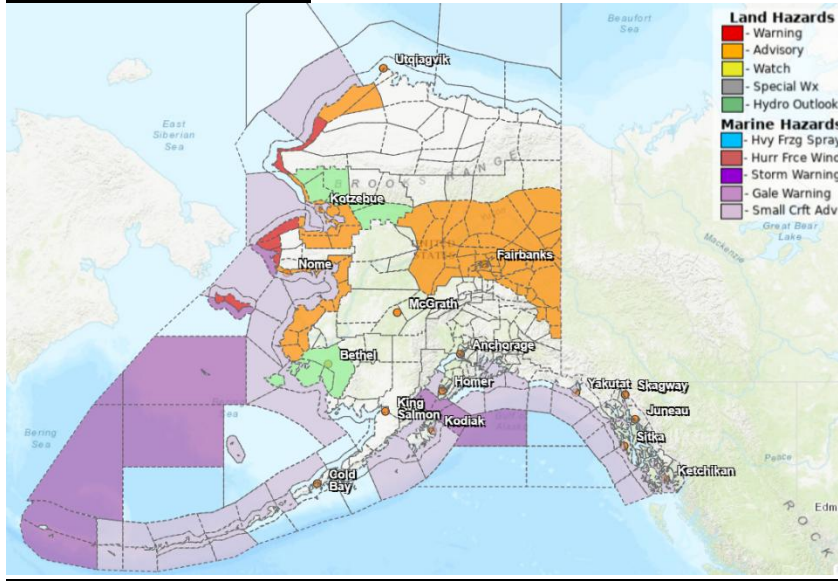

WARNINGS:

High Wind Warnings are in effect for Shishmaref, the Bering Strait Coast, and St. Lawrence Island from 10:00 PM Wednesday through 4:00 PM Friday, and for the Western Arctic Coast from 4:00 AM Thursday through 4:00 PM Friday.

ADVISORIES:

High Surf Advisories are in effect for Kivalina and Red Dog Dock, Lower Kobuk Valley, Baldwin Peninsula, and Northern Seward Peninsula through 4:00 AM Saturday; the Western and Northwest Arctic Coasts from 10:00 PM Wednesday through 4:00 AM Saturday; and the Yukon Delta Coast, Shishmaref, Bering Strait Coast, Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills, and Southern Seward Peninsula Coast through 10:00 PM Friday.

Wind Advisories remain in effect through 10:00 PM Wednesday for Tanana Flats, Fairbanks Metro Area, Nenana, Central Interior, Upper Koyukuk Valley, Dalton Highway Summits, Yukon Flats, White Mountains and high terrain south of the Yukon River, Fortymile Country, Upper Tanana Valley, Delta Junction, Upper Chena River Valley, Eielson AFB and Salcha, Goldstream Valley and Nenana Hills, Chatanika River Valley, and Two Rivers.

ALERTS:

Hydrologic Outlooks are in effect for the Interior Kuskokwim Delta and Kuskokwim Delta Coast due to elevated water levels expected along the Kuskokwim and Johnson Rivers Thursday and Friday. A Hydrologic Outlook is also in effect through Friday afternoon for the Kobuk, Noatak, and Wulik River valleys due to anticipated rainfall and rising water levels.
