Passage of a low front caused tactics to shift from suppression repair to hazards tree removal. Resources worked to extract trees out of roadways and identified trees on power lines. Smoke observed on the western flank north of Red Fox Road but no threat of spread outside containment lines.

NWS continues to track a storm moving from the Western Bering Sea through Siberia and into the Chukchi Sea later this week. Widespread heavy precipitation, strong winds, and high surf conditions are expected across Western Alaska, with breezy winds and light-to-moderate rain across the Interior.

The SEOC has contacted communities along the West Coast to ensure awareness of the incoming weather system. Local partners were encouraged to review preparedness measures, maintain situational awareness, and monitor NWS updates as conditions evolve.

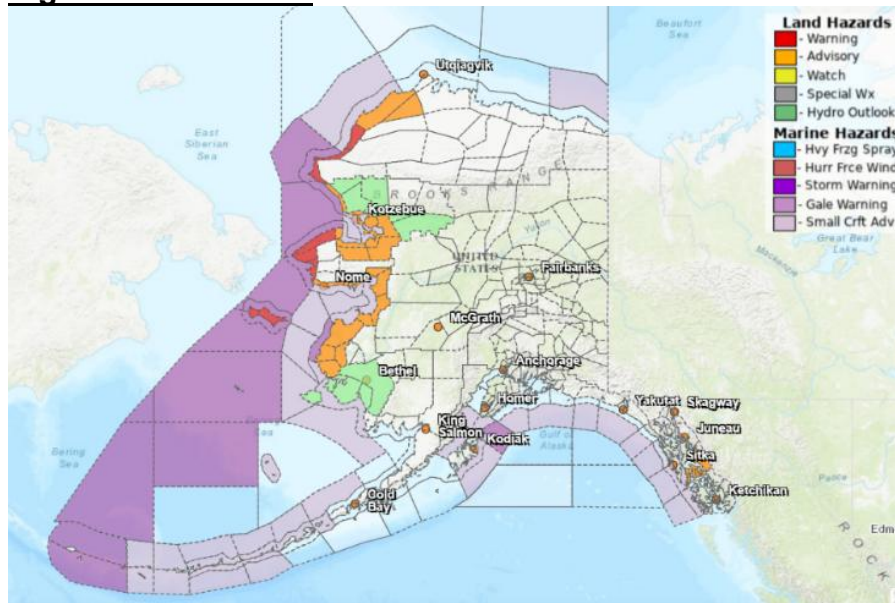
