Significant Issues:

Whitter Dock Fire

SEOC became aware of a dock fire in Whittier that also involved a small cruise ship. Whittier, Girdwood, and Anchorage Fire were supporting suppression operations, while the U.S. Coast Guard assessed environmental and safety concerns. No active search and rescue operations were involved in the incident, and no requests for SEOC assistance were received.

Tok Mukluk Fire

Acres: 7,339

Containment: 45%

Personnel: 20

West flank repair work is complete. The fire has been transitioned back to the local area and will remain in monitor status. Local resources will continue to monitor the area for hazards. Team Rubicon has completed debris management and building projects and is preparing to demobilize.

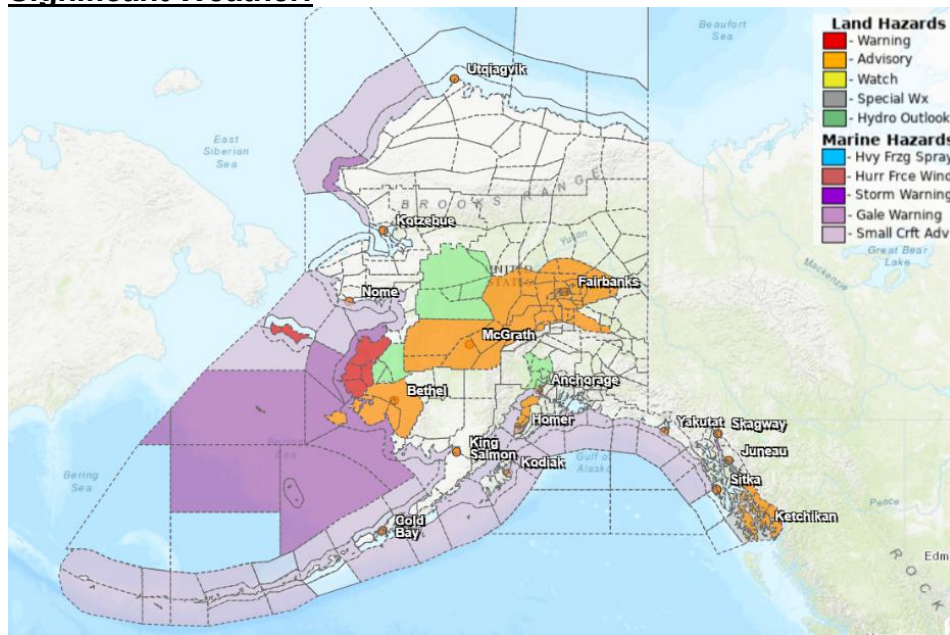

Flood Advisory: interior Kuskokwim Delta until 4 PM this afternoon.

Dense Fog Advisory: Prince of Wales Island; Ketchikan Gateway Borough; Annette Island; Petersburg Borough; City and Borough of Wrangell until 10 AM this morning.

Coastal Flood Advisory: Kuskokwim Delta Coast and Nunivak Island until 10 AM Wednesday.

High Wind Warning: St Lawrence Island from 10 PM Monday to 10 PM Tuesday; Yukon Delta Coast from 4 AM Tuesday to 4 AM Wednesday.

High Surf Advisory: Yukon Delta Coast from 4 AM Tuesday to 1 AM Wednesday.

Flood Watch: Upper Kuskokwim Valley through Friday afternoon; Two Rivers and Fairbanks Metro Area from Tuesday afternoon through Saturday afternoon.

Hydrologic Outlook: Heavy rain and rising rivers through Thursday afternoon for the Lower Yukon River, Lower Koyukuk Valley, Middle Yukon Valley, and Lower Yukon and Innoko Valleys; significant rainfall from this evening through Wednesday afternoon for the Matanuska and Susitna Valleys.
