Significant Issues:

Tok Wildland Fire - The joint Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) with FEMA began today. Individual Assistance (IA) and SBA assessments are being conducted in Tok, while Public Assistance (PA) assessments are being conducted virtually.

Kuskokwim Area High Water and Midweek Storm Outlook

Kasigluk – SEOC received a report from Kasigluk of one home inundated, additional high water surrounding other residences, and a possible oil sheen. SEOC contacted the community response partners. High water is being attributed to elevated levels on the Johnson River and Kuskokwim River. Water levels will continue to be monitored as another storm system is forecast to begin affecting the area on Wednesday.

Kwethluk – SEOC received a report of high water and road inundation in Kwethluk. Water levels are reported approximately 6–8 feet above normal, with some road access affected and water surrounding multiple residences and the new school. The community is monitoring conditions ahead of additional rainfall and the storm system expected Wednesday. SEOC contacted response partners and continues coordination with the community.

Other Villages – Alaska Association of Village Council Presidents reports several communities are experiencing elevated water levels following the recent storms and continued high water volumes on the Kuskokwim River and associated tributaries. SEOC and regional partners will continue monitoring conditions as another weather system approaches the region.

New Storm Wednesday – National Weather Service advised SEOC of a strong new storm system expected to begin affecting Alaska Wednesday. Forecast details will continue to be updated as confidence in the storm's track, timing, and potential impacts increases. Current forecasts indicate the system could bring additional precipitation, winds, and coastal water-level increases to portions of Alaska's west coast. SEOC is actively monitoring the storm and in regular contact with communities in the forecasted storm path.

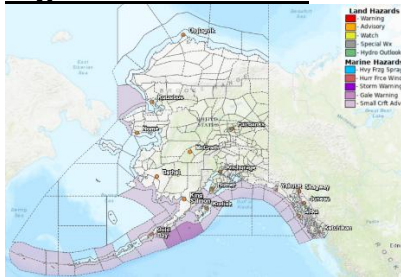
