Significant Issues:

Tok Wildland Fire:

The joint Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) with FEMA is underway. The Individual Assistance team, including SBA, is deployed to Tok and is conducting ground surveys. Public Assistance assessments are being conducted virtually.

Wednesday Forecast Storm:

SEOC receives an updated briefing from the National Weather Service regarding the storm forecast to begin affecting Alaska on Wednesday and associated with Typhoon Bujuan. The full energy of Typhoon Bujuan is not expected to combine with the approaching system, and significant storm surge is not currently anticipated.

Forecast details continue to be updated as confidence in the storm's track, timing, and potential impacts increases. Current impacts are expected to be focused across the Y-K Delta and Southwest Alaska. Given already elevated water levels in the region, some flooding is expected in Kuskokwim River area communities.

SEOC remains in regular contact with communities in the storm's path and receives an additional National Weather Service update tomorrow.

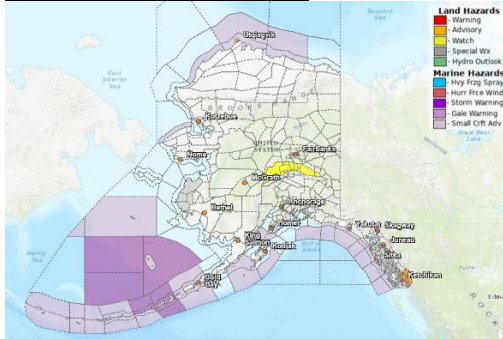
