## **Significant Issues:**

### Juneau GLOF:

The Juneau glacial lake outburst flood crested at 14.7 feet, earlier and significantly lower than the previous forecast of 15.8–16.3 feet. Water levels continue to fall, with Mendenhall Lake at 10.07 feet as of 7:15 p.m. Thursday. Juneau Unified Command later announced that the flood threat had ended and reopened evacuated areas for residents. The National Weather Service officially cancelled the Flood Warning for the City and Borough of Juneau at 7:59 p.m. Thursday, after water levels fell below moderate flood stage.

With the immediate threat now at low risk, Juneau will begin transitioning from response operations into recovery. In alignment with this transition, the SEOC returns to Preparedness Level 1 – Routine Operations. Local EOC Unified Command has demobilized.

Brotherhood Bridge is open to pedestrians, while Back Loop Bridge remains closed pending a safety assessment. The American Red Cross officially closed the emergency shelter, and damage assessments of homes and the HESCO barrier system are currently underway.

The Operations Section Chief will demobilize from Juneau today and return to Anchorage. The Public Information Officer will demobilize this weekend. The Division Supervisor will remain on the ground to support Unified Command through the transition from response to recovery and will demobilize Saturday evening once the transition is complete.

SEOC and Division staff will continue to support the City and Borough of Juneau and Tlingit & Haida in implementing the Governor's Disaster Declaration and associated public assistance efforts.

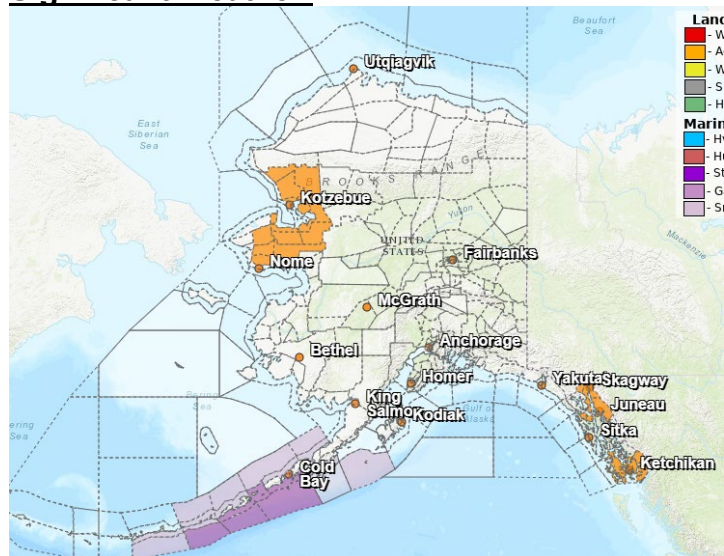
