Significant Issues:

SEOC Preparedness Level 2 - Heightened Awareness: Tok Wildland fire.
AICC Preparedness Level: 2

The Governor has verbally declared a state disaster emergency for the Alaska Gateway REAA, including Tok, because of the Mukluk Fire. The declaration authorizes both Public Assistance and Individual Assistance. FEMA has also approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant declaration, which reimburses the State for eligible fire suppression costs.

A Type 3 Incident Management Team is on scene shadowing the current IC staff in preparation to assume command later today.

Yesterday, the SEOC deployed a Division Supervisor to the Tok area to support the community and Tanana Chiefs Conference response efforts. She is attending briefs, and planning meetings held by the community members, fire command, and volunteer agencies to provide support and guidance in both response and recovery.

Alaska's Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD) and several agencies have provided much needed supplies for those affected by the ongoing wildland fire: American Red Cross (ARC) sent personnel and resources to assist and establish a shelter. Salvation Army is standing by with food and several critical supplies. The Food Bank of Alaska has donated pallets of disaster boxes. Tanana Chiefs Conference has personnel in Tok and are providing pallets of water and pet food. Numerous local community businesses and volunteers have donations available, including the local school staff providing meals at the school shelter.
