Significant Issues:

Tok Mukluk Fire -

- SEOC moved to Preparedness Level 3 to reflect the complexity and need to engage in an extended, coordinated interagency response. AICC remains at Preparedness Level: 2.
- SEOC Division Supervisor in Tok will be joined today by an additional Operations Specialist and Volunteer Agency Liaison Officer (VAL) to offer further support with ongoing operations.
- SEOC PIO and an Individual Assistance Specialist plan to deploy to Tok on Sunday to help set up the Disaster Assistance Center (DAC), scheduled to be open Monday through Wednesday (August 24-26).
- A Type 3 Incident Management Team took over command yesterday.
- Individual Assistance phone hotline and web site are now open through October 19, 2026, for disaster survivors to register:

 - Register online at Ready.Alaska.Gov
- Tuesday, August 18, the Governor verbally declared a state disaster emergency for the Alaska Gateway REAA, including Tok, because of the Mukluk Fire. The declaration authorizes both Public Assistance and Individual Assistance. FEMA has also approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant declaration, which reimburses the State for eligible fire suppression costs.
- Alaska's Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD) and several partner

agencies continue to provide critical supplies and support to those affected by the ongoing wildland fire.
