Significant Issues:

State at Fire Preparedness Level 5

The SEOC, with regards to wildland fire, concentrated on three main areas over the extended holiday weekend - Fairbanks North Star Borough and fires near the borough boundaries, the Nenana Ridge Complex and the Bear Creek Fire Group. As forecasted, extreme fire weather contributed to significant growth in several areas. SEOC deployed personnel to Nenana to assist local leadership and the Red Cross establish a shelter. Several evacuation status changes occurred and the SEOC ensured all alerts were posted and sent in a timely manner. All three areas have a shelter open with current occupation. The SEOC also facilitated numerous cooperative meetings with fire teams, Mass Care and local jurisdictional agencies.



South Slopes of the Eastern Brooks Range; Yukon Flats – in effect from noon today until 10p this evening for lightning.

South Slopes of the Central Brooks Range; Upper Koyukuk Valley; Dalton Highway Summits - in effect until midnight Monday night for lightning.

Upper Kobuk Valleys; Lower Koyukuk Valley-in effect until 10pm July 7 for lightning. **Hydrologic Outlook:**

Lower Matanuska Valley – High water on the Matanuska River along the Old Glenn Highway to remain elevated through early this week.
