Significant Issues:

State Disaster Declaration – Matanuska-Susitna Borough

Following five days of very strong winds and freezing temperatures, Governor Dunleavy declared a state disaster in the Matanuska-Susitna Borough. Disaster support programs included public assistance, individual assistance, and temporary housing assistance.

Napaskiak Power Disruption

The SEOC continues to follow up with local officials and partners as restoration and assessment activities proceed.

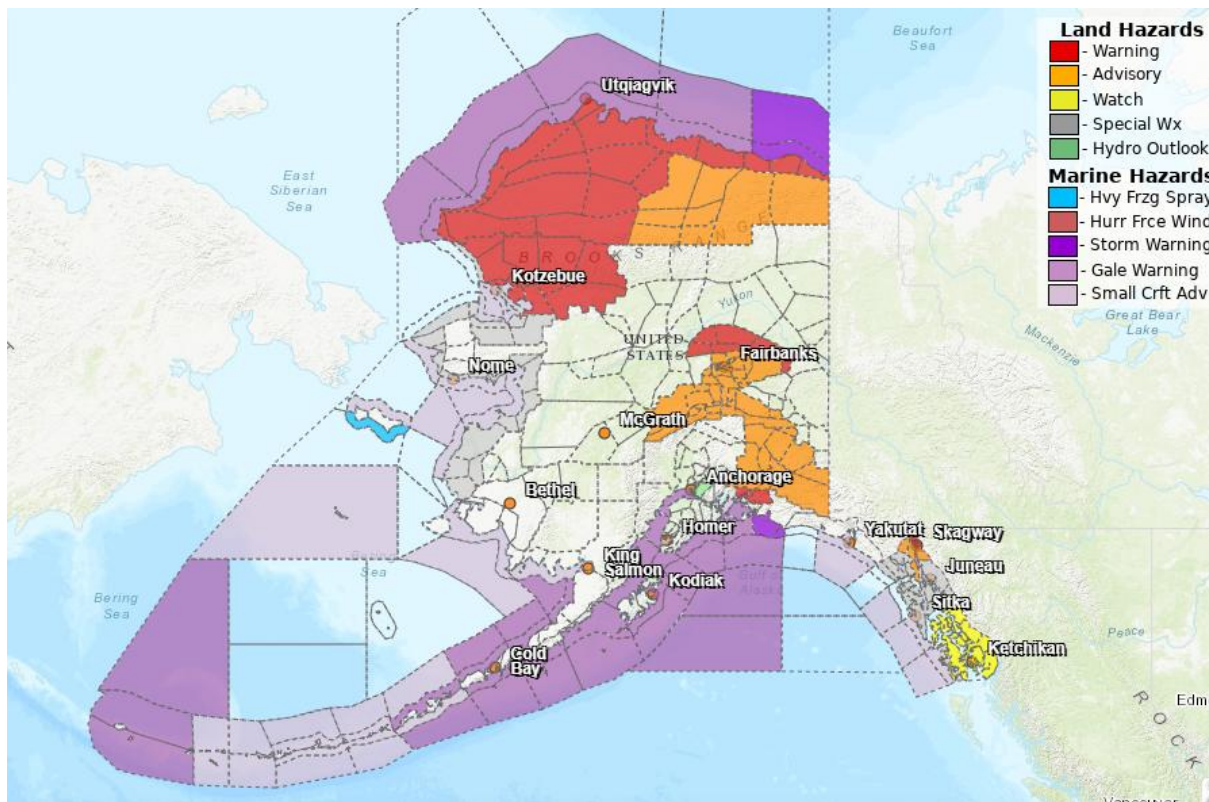

WARNINGS:

Winter Storm Warning – South Slopes of the Western Brooks Range; Noatak Valley; Lower Kobuk Valley; Upper Kobuk Valleys: Remains in effect until 11 AM AKST this morning.

Central Beaufort Sea Coast; Eastern Beaufort Sea Coast: Remains in effect until 9 AM AKST Sunday.

Western Arctic Coast; Northwest Arctic Coast; Northern Arctic Coast; Western Arctic Plains; Howard Pass and the Delong Mountains: Remains in effect until 9 PM AKST this evening.

White Mountains and high terrain south of the Yukon River: Remains in effect until 3 AM AKST Saturday.

Extreme Cold Warning – Municipality of Skagway: Remains in effect until 9 AM AKST this morning.

Kivalina and Red Dog Dock; Baldwin Peninsula; Northern Seward Peninsula; Shishmaref; Bering Strait Coast: Periods of light snow and blowing snow possible through Friday morning.

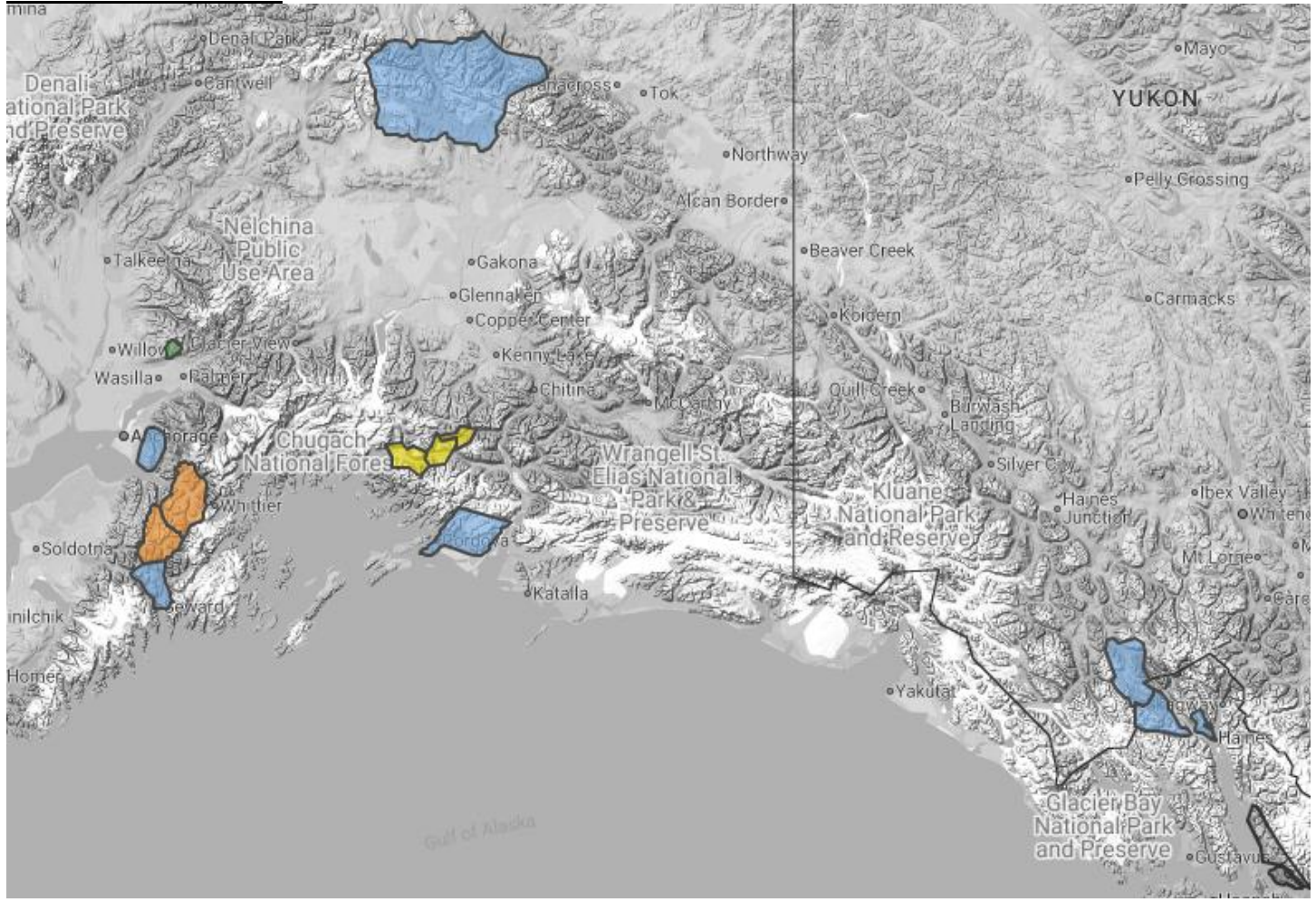

ALERTS:

Hydrologic Outlook – Anchorage; Anchorage Hillside and Eagle River: Freeze up for small rivers and streams in the Anchorage area.

Avalanche Hazards:



Hatcher Pass – Low above 2500'

Turnagain Pass and Girdwood – Considerable above 2,500' Moderate above 1,000, Low below tree line.

Summit Lake – Considerable above 2,500; Moderate between 1,000-2,500; Low below 1,000.

Valdez Maritime, Intermountain, and Continental – Moderate at all elevation levels.
