Significant Issues:

Kopsheut Wildland Fire:

A flare-up on the west side of the fire near the Kobuk River was quickly contained Saturday after ground crews and two water scoopers limited its growth to approximately 20 acres.

As of last night, the fire remains just under 1,500 acres and is 20% contained. With extremely dry conditions, firefighters expect the potential for additional afternoon flare-ups.

A total of 68 personnel, including smokejumpers, are now assigned to the incident. Crews are working both the eastern and western flanks of the fire to increase containment.

Fortunately, the fire has not significantly burned into deeper ground layers, allowing suppression efforts and water drops to be highly effective.

There is ongoing concern about smoke from the landfill where the fire originated, as burning trash can release harmful pollutants in addition to wildfire smoke. While smoke from the fire has not significantly impacted Ambler at this time, residents should remain aware of changing conditions, especially Elders, young children, and those with heart or respiratory conditions.

SEOC will continue to monitor this event and stand ready to support as needed.

Philippines Earthquake:

The SEOC monitored a magnitude 7.8 earthquake that occurred off the coast of Mindanao, Philippines, yesterday afternoon. Approximately one hour after the event, the National Tsunami

Warning Center issued a statement confirming that there was no tsunami threat to Alaska.

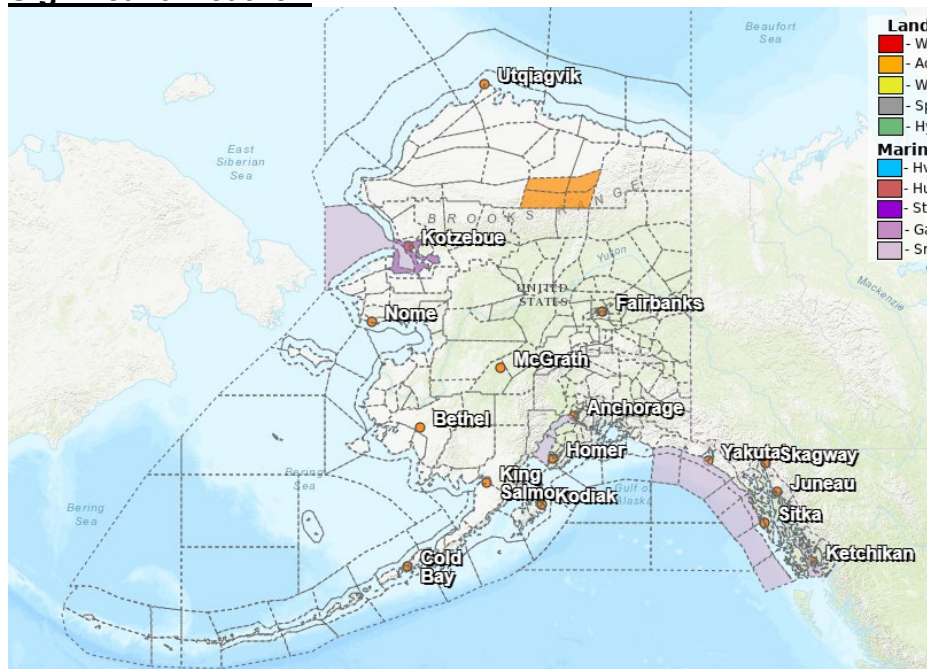

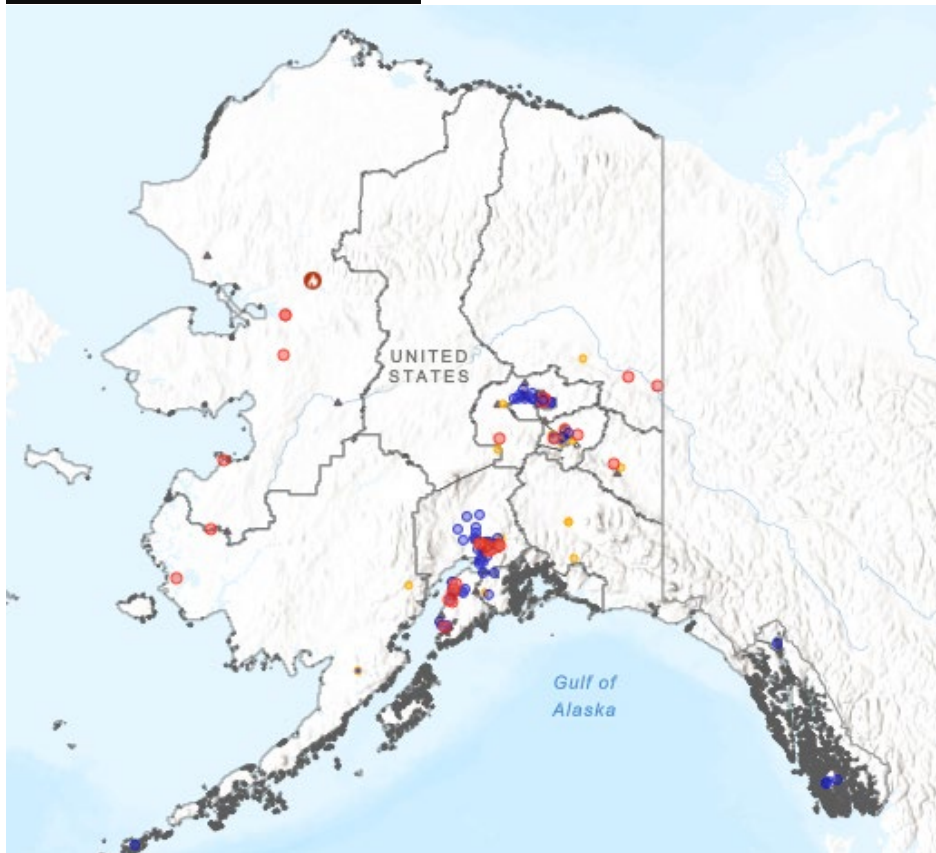


Frost Advisory in effect for Fairbanks Metro Area from 2am to 9am Tuesday morning.
