Significant Issues:

Tok Mukluk Fire:

The Mukluk Fire near Tok, Alaska, has burned approximately 7,333 acres and is currently 29% contained. The fire started August 17, 2026, and is burning primarily in black spruce, shrubs, and grass. Approximately 361 personnel remain assigned to the incident, with around 250 firefighters, engines, and heavy equipment actively working throughout neighborhoods impacted by the fire. Crews are conducting extensive mop-up and hazard mitigation operations to make the area safe for residents before reentry and damage assessments can proceed.

Firefighters are focused on extinguishing lingering heat around homes, driveways, and roads; removing unstable trees; sorting usable wood; and clearing woody debris for safe disposal. Excavators are supporting repair and recovery activities, and a dedicated utilities group has been established to coordinate directly with Alaska Power & Telephone on infrastructure repairs. Engines continue to patrol the eastern and western edges of the fire, while uncrewed aerial systems equipped with infrared cameras are being used to identify remaining heat. Firefighters from Yukon, Canada, and U.S. Forest Service Smokejumpers from Missoula have demobilized after providing critical assistance during the initial attack and early stages of the fire.

Weather conditions are expected to remain favorable, with cooler temperatures and shorter daylight hours limiting fire activity primarily to smoldering and creeping, although isolated torching trees remain possible. Six AKOM soldiers arrived Tuesday to support recovery efforts, and an Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) emergency management specialist from the East Coast is expected to arrive in Tok today.

The response is beginning to transition from active fire suppression toward recovery and community reentry. Although the Disaster Assistance Center closed in Tok yesterday, residents can continue to register for assistance online at ready.alaska.gov/IA or by calling 844-445-7131. The Red Cross shelter also closed yesterday, and Mass Care support staff and partner agencies will begin a phased demobilization from the community this week. Responding agencies and community partners continue to identify unmet needs and develop plans to address those needs. Firefighters and recovery personnel remain heavily engaged in the impacted neighborhoods, and residents are asked to avoid these areas while crews continue safety, utility, and recovery operations.

The SEOC will continue to support response efforts in Tok and implement the Governor's disaster declaration. SEOC will also continue to assist the community throughout the recovery process. Damage assessments will begin once the immediate fire threat has been mitigated and inspectors can safely access the affected areas.

Alaska Broadcasters Association:

SEOC hosted representatives from the Alaska Broadcasters Association yesterday afternoon. Representatives from radio and television stations toured the SEOC and received an overview of the critical role communications play in supporting active emergency response operations.

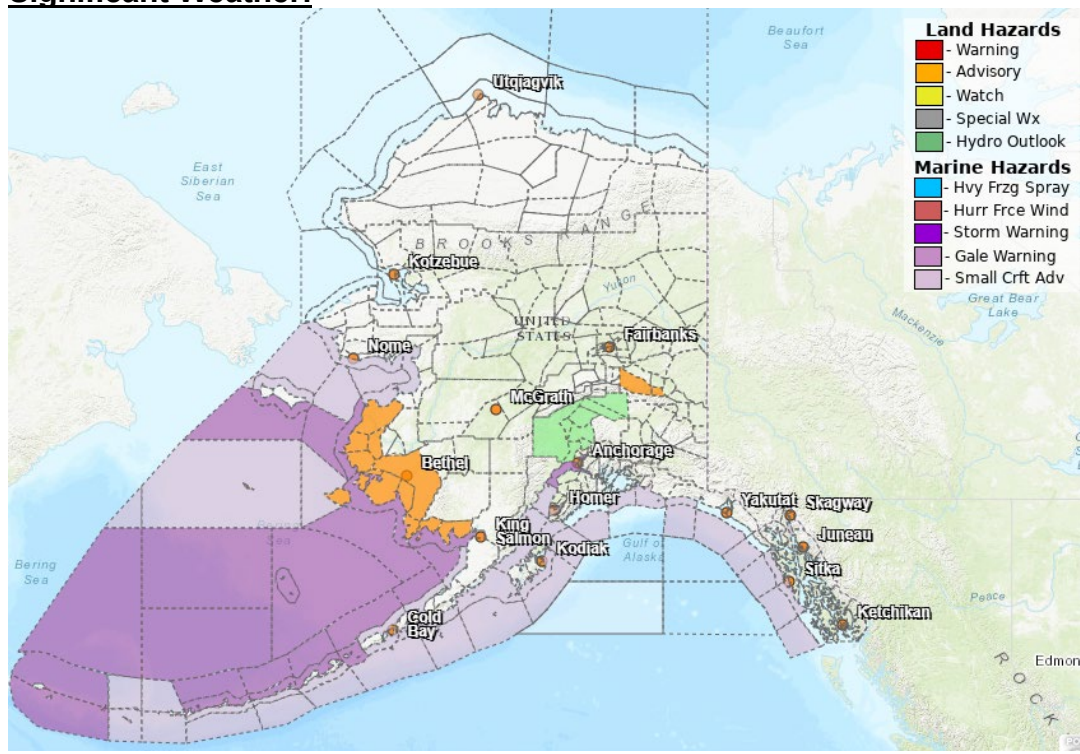
