Significant Issues:

Tok Mukluk Fire

Acres: 7,335

Containment: 29%

Location: Tok, AK

Start Date: Aug. 17, 2026

Fuels: Black Spruce, Shrubs, Grass

Personnel: 55

Work continues with crews patrolling control lines as needed and keeping roadways clear of debris. All suppression equipment has been removed from the fire area, and resources are nearing completion of repair objectives within the work area south of Red Fox Road.

Perimeter containment has been secured around the values at risk nearest the fire, including the east and west flanks and the southern portion of the perimeter adjacent to subdivisions north of the Alaska Highway. The northern portion of the fire remains indirectly confined by the Tanana River, changes in fuel type, and seasonal reductions in fuel availability and fire indices.

Bering Sea Storm

A strong Siberian/Chukchi Sea low will impact Northern and Western Alaska late Wednesday through Friday, bringing strong southwest winds, heavy rain, high surf, and elevated coastal water levels. Wind gusts may reach 60 mph, with water levels rising 2–5 feet above normal high tide and minor coastal erosion possible along portions of the West and Arctic Coasts.

SEOC will conduct community calls with potentially impacted communities to maintain situational awareness.

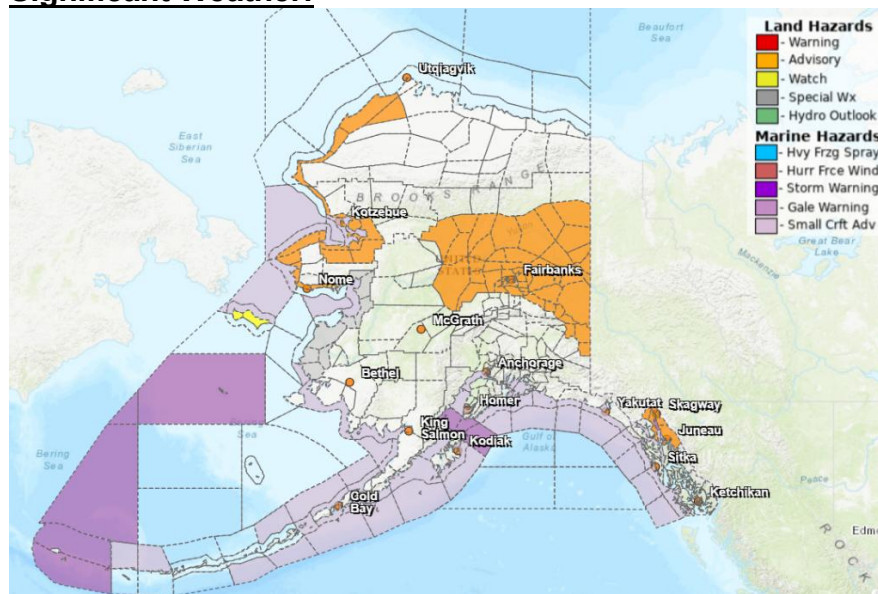
