Project Application & Development (PAD) Program Intent & Requirements

The intent of the State of Alaska Division of Homeland Security & Emergency Management (DHS&EM) Project Application & Development (PAD) Program is to assist Alaska communities in developing eligible projects for future submission to one of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Hazard Mitigation Programs (HMA). ***This is not a construction program*** but a program to help identify, scope and develop eligible mitigation projects to FEMA in order to address known hazards in a community.

- 1.) Community must have a current FEMA approved and locally adopted Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP) in place.
- 2.) Proposed hazard type to be studied or planned must be listed in the current HMP
- 3.) Community must own, operate or be legally responsible for proposed work area or asset to be mitigated in the future
- 4.) Community agrees in writing to work with DHS&EM contractors and staff
- 5.) Community agrees in writing that the intent of the PAD Program is to develop projects they will submit for future FEMA funding
- 6.) All proposals shall not exceed \$100,000 cap
- 7.) Proposed work shall not involve construction, demolition, or renovation of any building or building component
- 8.) Proposed work shall not conflict or cross over into any other state or federal funding sources. This will result in immediate stoppage of work.
- 9.) Proposed work must be in accordance with allowable work types as outlined in the FEMA HMA Guidance.
