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# **THE STATE OF ALASKA 2020-2022 MULTI-YEAR TRAINING & EXERCISE PLAN (MYTEP)**

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**Promulgated on July 1, 2019**

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## Preface

The plans covered in this document are ultimately designed to foster the State of Alaska's alignment with the National Preparedness Goal.

*"A secure and resilient nation with the capabilities required across the whole community to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from the threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk."*

For the State to reach this goal, it is imperative that training and exercises are planned and executed. The plans in this document are not developed to be a rigid, non-flexible schedule of events. On the contrary, this Multi-Year forecast is moldable as time, situations and events change. Pursuant to the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program, each year the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHS&EM) will review this document during the annual Training and Exercise Plan Workshop (TEPW) and, collectively with attending stakeholders, make changes that will allow the citizens of Alaska to be trained and involved with exercises that evolve the State into a more secure and resilient place.

This document is designed to collect and prioritize the strategies of the emergency management stakeholders, each year, and move forward with a plan for the whole community to attain the aforementioned goal. In this Multi-Year plan you will find the purpose of this document, the priorities decided upon, how the priorities will be addressed through exercise and training and a three-year training and exercise schedule.





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## Purpose

The purpose of the Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan (MYTEP) is to document the State of Alaska's overall training and exercise program priorities for a specific time period. It is considered to be a living document that can be updated and refined regularly. These priorities are linked to corresponding core capabilities, and, if applicable, a rationale based on existing strategic guidance, threat assessments, corrective actions from previous exercises and real-world events, or other factors. This MYTEP identifies the training and exercises that will help DHS&EM build and sustain the core capabilities needed to address its training and exercise program priorities.

The MYTEP outlines a combination of progressively building exercises – along with the associated training requirements – which address the priorities identified in the TEPW. A progressive, multi-year exercise program enables State, Local, Tribal and Territorial (SLTT) jurisdictions to participate in a series of increasingly complex exercises, with each successive exercise building upon the previous one until mastery is achieved. Further, by including training requirements in the planning process, SLTT jurisdictions can address known shortfalls prior to exercising capabilities.

Pursuant to AS 26.20.025 and AS 26.23.040, this document aligns with the requirements to prepare and implement comprehensive plans and programs for homeland security and to establish and operate training programs. This document also aligns with Presidential Preparedness Directive 8 (PPD-8); state executive guidance; and stakeholder training and exercise plans and forecasts.

Included in this Multi-Year TEP is a training and exercise schedule, which provides a graphic illustration of the proposed activities scheduled for the years 2020 through 2022.

## Program Priorities

The State Principals' Priorities are decided upon by the Exercise and Training Officers in conjunction with DHS&EM leadership. These priorities serve to guide the training and exercise programs' areas of focus during a defined period, set against the Alaska Shield cycle. These specific priority areas are determined by consideration of multiple factors such as the State Threat & Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA), Stakeholder Preparedness Review (SPR), After-Action Reports / Improvement Plans (AAR/IPs), community-based Alaska Assessments, and others.

1. Earthquake Preparedness and Resiliency: Earthquakes are a known hazard to Alaska as part of the Pacific Ring of Fire. The unknowns are the times and magnitudes of potentially catastrophic events. Applying lessons learned from previous events and conducting future exercises are of paramount importance to protecting the lives of Alaskans.
2. Supply Chain Preparedness and Resiliency: Being geographically separated from the contiguous United States, harsh weather conditions, and limited and time-consuming supply routes demand critical infrastructure stability for Alaska's resiliency during and after natural disasters and manmade threats.
3. Short-Term Recovery: Short-term recovery efforts are geared towards health and safety needs beyond rescue, and ends with the transition to long-term recovery groups and the initiation of plans for permanent repairs, such as to roads or the rebuilding of houses.

## Priority 1: Earthquake Preparedness and Resiliency

The November 2018 Cook Inlet Earthquake was a vivid reminder of Alaska's need to be prepared for a large scale earthquake, and the cascading effects thereof. Although coastal communities shoulder the largest burden of the threat during an earthquake, all of Alaska is at risk. In order for Alaska communities to be resilient in the face of the effects of an earthquake, we must prepare.

### Corresponding Core Capabilities:

Operational Coordination - Establish and maintain a unified and coordinated operational structure and process that appropriately integrates all critical stakeholders and supports the execution of Core Capabilities.

Fatality Management Services - Provide fatality management services, including decedent remains recovery and victim identification, and work with local, state, tribal, territorial, insular area, and Federal authorities to provide mortuary processes, temporary storage or permanent internment solutions, sharing information with mass care services for the purpose of reunifying family members and caregivers with missing persons/remains, and providing counseling to the bereaved.

Mass Care Services - Provide life-sustaining and human services to the affected population, to include hydration, feeding, sheltering, temporary housing, evacuee support, reunification, and distribution of emergency supplies.

Mass Search and Rescue Operations - Deliver traditional and atypical search and rescue capabilities, including personnel, services, animals, and assets to survivors in need, with the goal of saving the greatest number of endangered lives in the shortest time possible.

### Rationale:

In the 2017 and 2018 SPR documents, the above core capabilities were identified as lacking capability and confidence. The benchmark for inclusion as a priority for the 2020-2022 time-period was a rating in Exercise, Training or Confidence of 2 or less out of a possible 5. Additionally, based on the AAR/IP of the November 2018 Cook Inlet Earthquake and the future focus of Alaska Shield 2022, this area was identified as a main priority for addressing in the current principals' objectives.

## Priority 2: Supply Chain Preparedness and Resiliency

Alaska's critical infrastructure has known weaknesses that have potential to be exploited by natural, or manmade disasters. No amount of preparation will preclude Alaska's infrastructure from failing. However, we can prepare for any degradation through training and exercise.

### Corresponding Core Capabilities:

Operational Coordination - Establish and maintain a unified and coordinated operational structure and process that appropriately integrates all critical stakeholders and supports the execution of Core Capabilities.

Critical Transportation - Provide transportation (including infrastructure access and accessible transportation services) for response priority objectives, including the evacuation of people and animals and the delivery of vital response personnel, equipment, and services into the affected areas.

Logistics & Supply Chain Management - Deliver essential commodities, equipment, and services in

support of impacted communities and survivors, to include emergency power and fuel support, as well as the coordination of access to community staples. Synchronize logistics capabilities and enable the restoration of impacted supply chains.

Housing - Implement housing solutions that effectively support the needs of the whole community and contribute to its sustainability and resilience.

**Rationale:**

In the 2017 and 2018 SPR documents, the above core capabilities were identified as lacking capability and confidence. The benchmark for inclusion as a priority for the 2020-2022 time-period was a rating in Exercise, Training or Confidence of 2 or less out of a possible 5. Additionally, based on the AAR/IP of the November 2018 Cook Inlet Earthquake and the future focus of Alaska Shield 2022, this area was identified as a main priority for addressing in the current principals' objectives.

### Priority 3: Short-term Recovery

Alaska's geographic separation from the rest of the United States creates a unique challenge to recovery efforts. Alaska's economy is fairly isolated, and there is a limited surplus to housing. As was seen in November 2018, unoccupied residential buildings also sustained damage that removed them as potential housing options following the earthquake. Overcoming challenges of this nature is imperative to ensure the best response possible for our state.

**Corresponding Core Capabilities:**

Economic Recovery - Return economic and business activities (including food and agriculture) to a healthy state and develop new business and employment opportunities that result in an economically viable community.

Natural & Cultural Resources - Protect natural and cultural resources and historic properties through appropriate planning, mitigation, response, and recovery actions to preserve, conserve, rehabilitate, and restore them consistent with post-disaster community priorities and best practices and in compliance with applicable environmental and historic preservation laws and executive orders.

Housing - Implement housing solutions that effectively support the needs of the whole community and contribute to its sustainability and resilience.

**Rationale:**

In the 2017 and 2018 SPR documents, the above core capabilities were identified as lacking capability and confidence. The benchmark for inclusion as a priority for the 2020-2022 time-period was a rating in Exercise, Training or Confidence of 2 or less out of a possible 5.
